2025 WHITE BUFFALO DEER HARVEST REPORT. Read where the 79 deer were killed and much more. This is from White Buffalo:

Pre-baiting was conducted from 12 December 2024 – 2 January 2025. Sharpshooting efforts were conducted from 3 – 14 January 2025. Eleven days of fieldwork were required to achieve the harvest of 79 deer.

During the 2025 project, winter weather conditions prevailed for most of the project. Inclement weather caused operations to be canceled on one occasion due to blizzard

conditions. Frigid cold night time temperatures and highs near the freezing point created icy conditions the last several days of the project.

An archery hunt was initiated in Queeny Park during the 2020–2021 hunting season. This hunt has resulted in the removal of 30, 37, 27, 22, and 18 deer in 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024 respectively. Harvest through this program should be additive to the ongoing management efforts in Town and Country. Looking forward, the program would benefit by obtaining additional access points in the following areas: 1) the eastern boundary of Queeny Park, and 2) along Topping Road. This recommendation is based on the number of deer generally observed in these areas in combination with a current lack of operations access.

There are three notable items from this year's effort. First is **the number of coyotes** observed. The number of **coyotes** was first cited in the 2023 report. This year, coyotes were either directly observed, or photos were captured on game cameras, at every site. While in previous years we would occasionally observe **coyotes** or capture photos of them, this year it was a common occurrence, with multiple coyotes observed on occasion and some during daylight hours. The second item was the lack of juvenile deer. This was also mentioned the last two years and continues to trend below average. We would expect juvenile deer to make up ~40 percent of the harvest, this year it was ~14 percent. The third item is the number of yearling males. Typically, we would expect yearling males to make up ~10 percent of the harvest. The number of yearling males has been noted previously but this year they comprised nearly three times what would be expected at 31.5 percent of the harvest.

Similar to last year, 5 deer were donated to the Saint Louis Zoo's American Red Wolf Conservation and Recovery Facility as permitted by The Missouri Department of Conservation. Seventy four deer, totaling 3,700 pounds of prepared meat, were processed by John's Butcher Shop and donated to Operation Food Search.

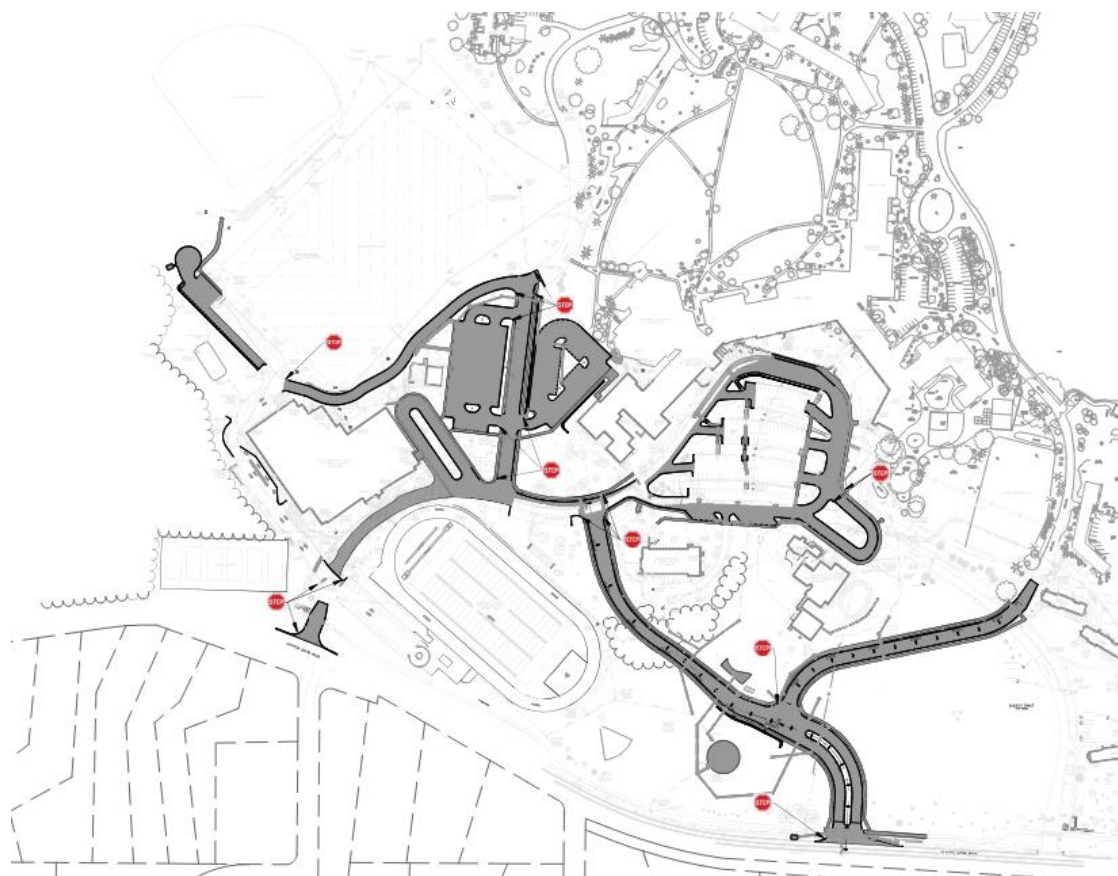

PRINCIPIA CAMPUS ENTRANCE AND ON CAMPUS ROADS. Principia memo:

TRAFFIC AND ACCESS – A traffic study has been submitted by Volkert, Inc. This study came to the following conclusions:

- A 32% growth in enrollment will generate 90-130 additional trips during peak hours.
- The improvement of the west entrance will help eliminate drive confusion and unexpected vehicle maneuvers.
- The new east entrance will increase the amount of space (storage) for southbound vehicles making a left-turn out of the campus and also provide greater separation with the existing Chapel Hill/Dry Ridge/Vandiver subdivision entrances.
- A traffic signal is not warranted at the new east entrance; however a right turn lane for westbound Clayton Road traffic is warranted (see Condition G).
- The projected enrollment growth does not warrant any improvements at the other study intersections



Both east and west entrances are off Clayton Road.

2025 POLICE DODGE SUVS BEING PURCHASED FROM AN INDEPENDENCE MO DEALER. Police vehicles at competitive prices are bid annually statewide, so it is not unusual to buy vehicle at the lowest prices from dealers out of the Metro area.

This year Town and Country is buying three Dodge Durango SUV from Landmark Dodge in Independence, Missouri for \$132,979 (\$44,326 each).



Durango models have become popular with police departments across the country even in New York City with its heavy traffic and crowded streets.

This is from a memo by Chief Dan Wilkey about the purchase:

- A 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe patrol vehicle with a current mileage of over 135,000 miles will be decommissioned and sold at auction.
- A 2021 Ford F150 patrol vehicle with a current mileage of over 80,000 miles will be moved from primary fleet status to reserve status.
- Carrying out the planned expansion of vehicles assigned to the patrol fleet to maintain lower mileage, dependable vehicles to be used as reserve vehicles for training, special events, and to supplement primary fleet vehicles downed for service.

The AutoBlog in 2024 reported a mechanical problem the Indiana State Police are having with their Durango SUVs.

The Indiana State Police ordered 519 Durango Pursuits to take over for their aging fleet of Dodge Chargers, but of the 219 put into service since May 2023, the agency has seen 39 of them crippled by a failing oil cooler. Warranty repairs can take up to two months, leaving the agency without vehicles for extended periods.

Officers responded to calls for service to include alarms, traffic complaints, animal running loose, found property, check the welfare, child lock out, sick cases and keep the peace.

IN CHESTERFIELD NOT ALL DWI SUSPECTS ARE FOUND GUILTY OR NOT GUILTY. IN SOME CASES THE RECORDS OF THE COURT FILING NOW CAN DISAPPEAR: I keep a list in alphabetical order of people arrested for DWI and Stealing.

Recently I was checking for dispositions because if there is a guilty plea or a guilty plea with a 2-year probation I can then request a police report and mugshot for the Drunks and Thieves Newsletters. I was surprised that a number of cases were no longer in casenet, the statewide file of court cases.

I ran across one from 2022 that my records showed should still be active. It was no longer in casenet so I sent an email to the Chesterfield Court Clerk.

Here is what I learned from the Chesterfield Court Clerk:

The case you are inquiry about is a pending case with no disposition and is not a public record. Due to the security of this case I am unable to discuss any specific details at this time.

Chesterfield started an Alternative Court in 2023. Chesterfield's alternative court initiative is a promising approach to justice, especially with its focus on rehabilitation and intensive supervision. By emphasizing frequent judicial oversight, the program likely aims to ensure participants are actively engaged in their rehabilitation process and are held accountable for their progress. This approach might help address underlying issues, such as substance abuse or mental health problems, rather than relying solely on punitive measures.

My website and newsletters have an attorney on retainer who handles various legal matters. He was an assistant US Trial Attorney for over a quarter-of-a-century. I asked him to look into this and he was amazed and shocked that people charged with a fairly serious and a graduated felony would be able to avoid making a plea after a DWI arrest.

Here is what he sent me:

Here's the info regarding confidentiality:

When an application for admission to the 21st Judicial Circuit DWI Court is received, an electronic file, separate from the criminal case file will be created and maintained as a confidential and closed file not accessible to the public or to any person not a part of the DWI Court Team. The file will contain a photo of the participant, docket entry relative to each DWI Court appearance as well as testing results, progress notes, and DWI Court sanctions and incentives imposed. The information contained in the file will not, under any circumstances, be used against the participant in any other court of law.

Members of the DWI Court Team are under an ethical obligation not to discuss the information obtained in DWI Court in any other form without the express written consent of the participant. A participant's progress and success or failure in the DWI Court program will not be revealed to any person who is not part of the DWI Court Team without the written authorization of the participant.

While DWI Court proceedings may occasionally be observed by teams from other courts, those persons will be under the same rules of confidentiality that apply to the members of the 21st Judicial Circuit DWI Court Team.

Federal law and regulations protect the confidentiality of drug and alcohol abuse patient records. A violation of those laws and regulations constitutes a crime. If a violation is suspected, it may be reported to the appropriate authorities in accordance with federal regulations.

The person I was checking on for a court disposition since her arrest in 2022 is 33-year-old, so she should certainly be aware of the serious nature for DWI.

Here is our reporting of her arrest in Newsletter 540 from July 16, 2022 on a July 9, 2022 DWI arrest and much more:

In a case like this it seems the public has the right to know the facts. If Madigan plead guilty she'd still be placed on probation with a requirement she attends DWI programs.

IS IT FAIR? Is it fair to people who mail in their speeding ticket fines and get points while DWI drivers don't? Is it fair for good drivers to underwrite DWI drivers when insurance companies can't find the DWI arrests of people renewing their insurance?

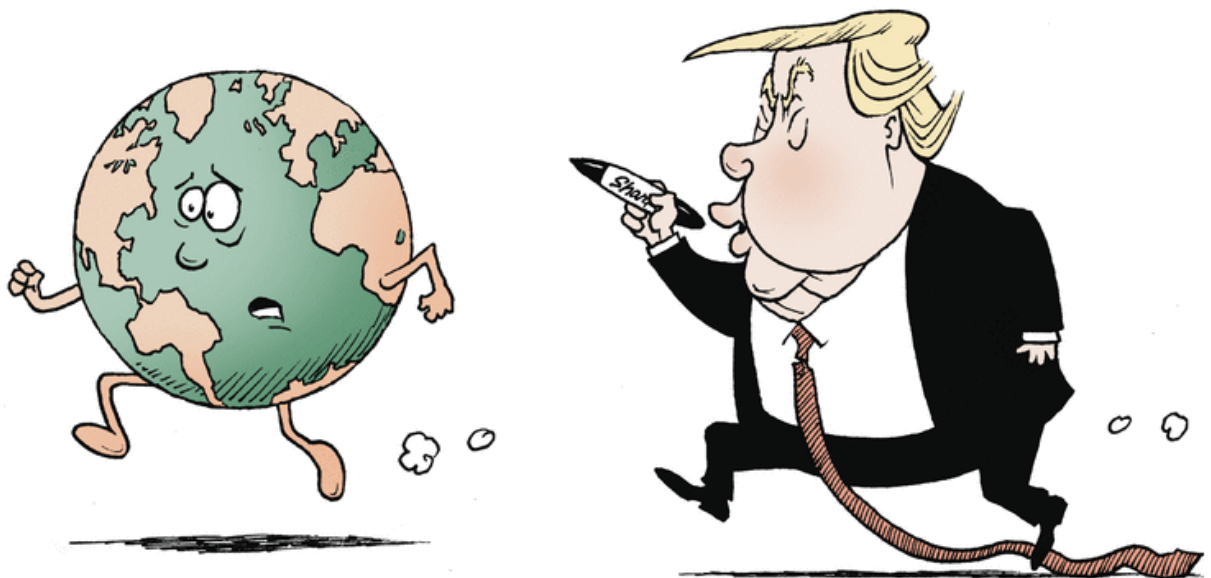
Is it fair to safe drivers for drunk drivers having their arrests erased?

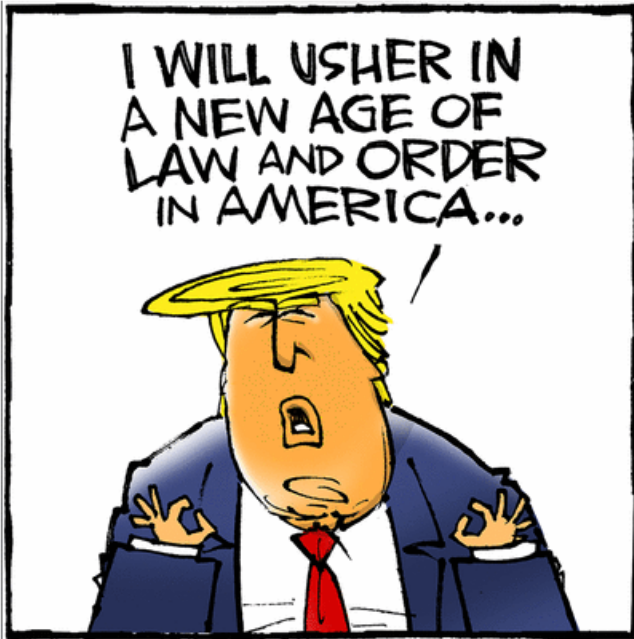

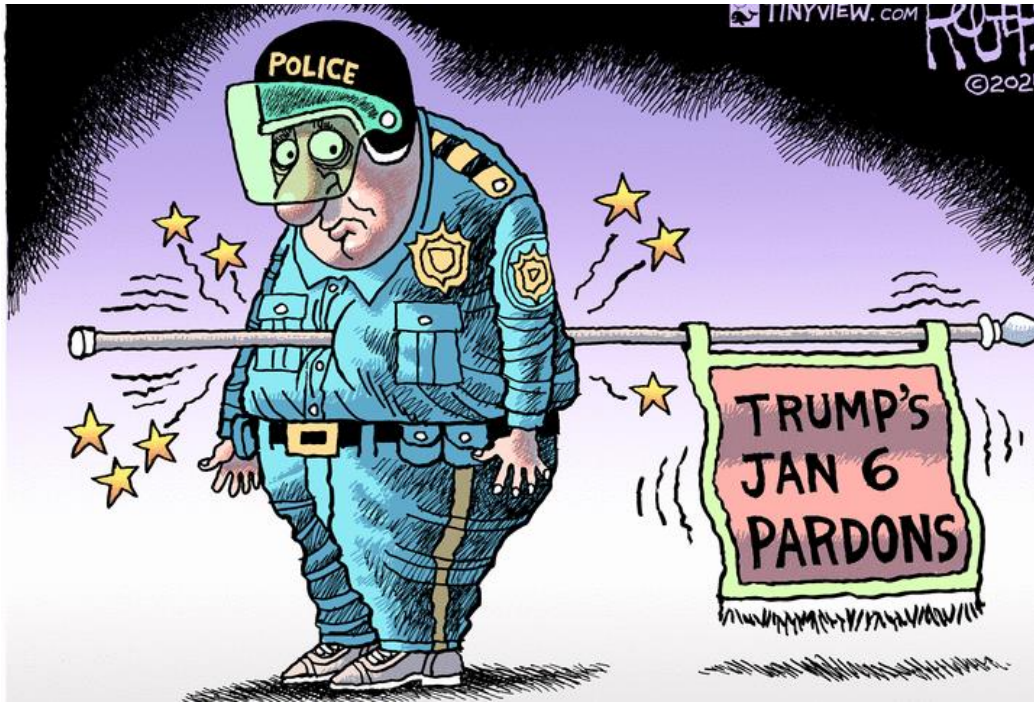
