The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Town and Country police responded to a residence at 908 Weidman Road for a report that a female suspect was ramming the garage doors of the residence. On arrival they located victim, lying on the driveway in front of the garage, suffering from severe injuries. Victim was transported to the hospital and diagnosed with a fractured skull with a brain bleed, a broken arm and other internal injuries. The vehicle used by the suspect (a Genesis SUV) was left behind at the scene. A paramedic who arrived to treat victim said they had seen a white female walking into a nearby wooded area. Police located defendant, matching the description, in the wooded area. She admitted that she had been present at the house and said she had gone there to kill another man (not victim). In addition to the damage to the house, defendant's vehicle had also damaged a work vehicle in the possession of victim.

We originally reported about this arrest, where Dallman went to the wrong house and attacked the homeowner.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: 1. On January 12, 2025, police arrive at 617 Aspen Ridge, St. Louis County for a domestic disturbance. 2. Victim Father RD, tells police his son was intoxicated and attacked him for no reason by punching him multiple times. 3. Police find defendant hiding in the bathroom.

Police are told defendant has alcohol, mental health issues and suicidal issues. 4. Police later overhear defendant state to his mother that he will murder his father and he will slit his father's throat with a knife and watch him bleed out. 5. Defendant currently is hospitalized in a psychiatric unit at Mercy. 6.

Defendant has previously been arrested in 2022 for felony domestic assault but his father did not wish to prosecute at that time. 7. Defendant is a flight risk and danger to the victim and community based on the above listed facts.

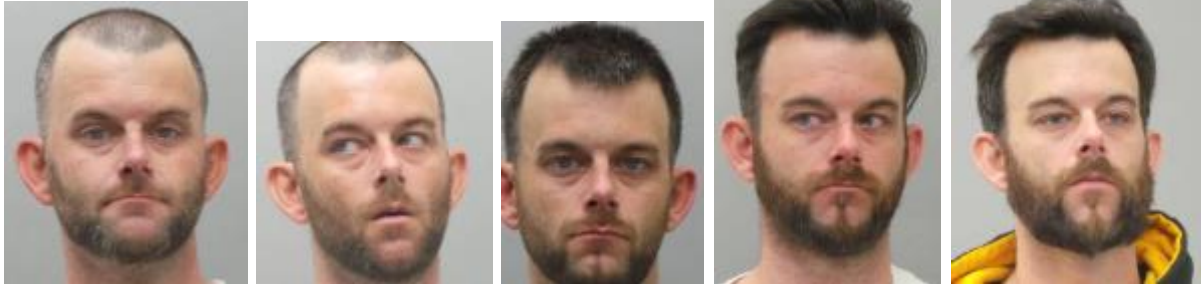

CHESTERFIELD CITY COUNCIL MEETING 02/03/25



SUNSHINE LAW REVIEW BY THE MAYOR BEFORE A CANDIDATE FOR COUNCIL SPOKE REVEALING HOW THE COUNCIL WAS SECRETLY TRYING TO BUY A 5-STORY OFFICE BUILDING.

The meeting started with Mayor Bob Nation doing a rambling reading of the Missouri open record Sunshine Law specially on real estate purchases and leases. It was somewhat unclear why until a short time later when he called on the only person registered to speak, Patricia Tocco, who is running in April for a Ward-2 Council seat.

Tocco stated she discovered by reviewing the city’s legal bills that the City Council has been holding closed door meetings about a possible purchase of a building at 16150 Main Circle Drive



Tocco stated the Council as a whole or no council person has said why the city wanted to buy a 5-story 100,000 sq ft building that has many long term leases.

The city has also been hit with legal bills in excess of \$19,000 concerning Main Circle Drive building negotiations according to Tocco.

The only comment by the Mayor at the end of Pat Tocco's presentation was that this is no longer an issue as negotiations have ended and there would be no sale.

Mayor Nation seemed to be claiming that negotiations for leases or property purchases are closed to the public. Since there was no sale he and apparently some on the Council thought the taxpayers didn't need to know about it. But since there was no sale it seems that the negotiations are now a public record. Citizens have a right to know why the city wanted to buy the building in the first place.

I spoke with Councilwoman Barb McGuinness who indicated that she and the mayor were not in favor of buying the building.

"I believe City Government should be about the "Ps," said McGuinness. "Police, Planning, Public Works and Parks."

McGuinness would not give details about the purchase discussed in the closed meetings other than she and the mayor were against it. She did add that the City will be out of debt for all projects including construction of City Hall by 2027 and she felt there was absolutely no reason to do something to put the City back in debt.

That implies perhaps Mayor Nation vetoed passage to buy the building and it was overturned by at least six councilpersons. However, Councilwoman McGuinness was reluctant to confirm this.

Pat Tocco should get an award from taxpayers for finding this out.

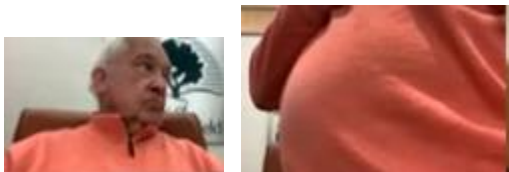


SPECIAL MARIJUANA TAX IS A DEAD ISSUE WITH THE FINANCE COMMISSION.
