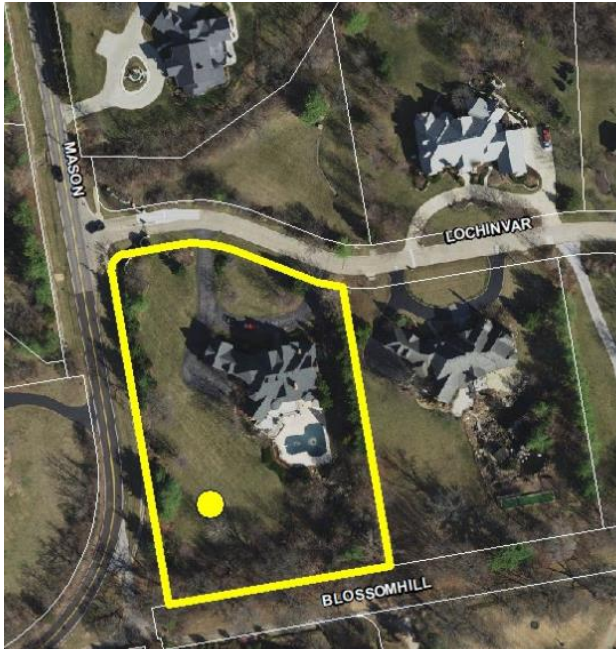

FLORISSANT MAN SUES TOWN AND COUNTRY BY FILEING PROPERTY LIENS FOR \$100-BILLION OVER TRAFFIC CITATIONS.

Dwayne J. Harris, 46, of Florissant received two traffic tickets in Town and Country on March 1, 2023 for Speeding 20-25 over the limit and No Car Insurance. He went to trial, was found guilty and fined \$220. He has since filed property liens against numerous city properties and the property of court officers and police officers. He has also filed similar liens in Maryland Heights after being issued two traffic citations there.

The wording in liens matches that of far...far right wingers calling themselves “sovereign citizens.”

Here is Harris court record. The Maryland Heights judge has recused himself from the two traffic tickets in his court.

PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW UNDER SECTION 570.095 RSMO
WITH STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

The Respondent in this Cause has specifically targeted the City of Town & Country and several of its appointed officials, employees and Municipal Judge with numerous fraudulent recorded documents and UCC filings. Based on written documents submitted to the City by the

Respondent and the fraudulent documents themselves, it is clear that Respondent's unlawful conduct is in retaliation for two traffic tickets that Respondent received and which were adjudicated in the 21st Judicial Circuit, Town & Country Municipal Division.

Respondent filed false and fraudulent documents relating to several parcels of property owned by the City of Town & Country, the City's Municipal Prosecuting Attorney and the Municipal Judge who presides in the Town & Country Municipal Division of the 21st Judicial Circuit.

Respondent's false and fraudulent filings suggest that he has judgments, liens and claims against the properties and owners of such real estate, including, but not limited to, (i) a "lien of 100,000,000,000,000...ONE HUNDRED BILLION..."; (ii) a "fee of \$95,000" because "THE CITY OF TOWN AND COUNTRY MUNICIPAL COURTS have been and are currently committing securities fraud and tax evasion through outright deception, which involves crafting municipal bonds using aliases such as DWAYNE JEMON HARRIS, to trade these bonds using CUSIP numbers, which are the court case numbers, on the primary and secondary markets"; (iii) that the City and certain city officials, employees, and the Municipal Judge "surrenders any and

all type(s) of assets including...physical property...police cars...controlled parks, personal houses, personal vacation houses...boats, planes...minerals like gold and silver, intellectual property...”; and (iv) a lien against the City and each official and their properties in the amount of “\$101,999,709,253.00, One Hundred One Billion, Nine Hundred Ninety-nine Million, Seven Hundred Nine Thousand, Two Hundred Fifty-Three Dollars and Zero Cents” and that Respondent “may take possession of the collateral...and may sell, lease, license or otherwise dispose of” it.

Respondent’s actions are in violation of Section 570.095 RSMo, as such filings are invalid, contain materially false information, and was, upon information and belief filed by Respondent to the purpose of harassing, injuring, defrauding and retaliating against the City and its municipal officials, employees, and Municipal Judge following the adjudication of Respondent’s traffic tickets in the Town & Country Municipal Division of the 21st Judicial Circuit.

Statement of Probable Cause

In support of its above Petition for Judicial Review, Petitioner states to the Court as follows:

6. Many of the City's elected and appointed officials and the Municipal Judge own real estate in St. Louis County.

7. Respondent has filed false and fraudulent documents with the St. Louis County Recorder of Deeds and the Missouri Secretary of State relating to the following properties in which the City or its officials, employees or Municipal Judge have an interest:

8. In addition, Respondent filed false and fraudulent documents relating to real estate located at 8029 Davis Drive erroneously believing that it is owned by a city official.

9. Respondent's false and fraudulent documents suggest that he has judgments, liens and claims against the properties and owners of such real estate and that the city officials who are owners of such property have surrender such property to him or that he is foreclosing on such property.

10. Respondent has no legitimate interest in any of the properties listed herein.

11. Respondent has no legitimate judgment, claim or lien against the City, its officials, employees and Municipal Judge.

12. The documents are materially false, are fraudulent and are invalid.

13. The filings are in retaliation for the adjudication of two traffic tickets for which Respondent was found guilty.

14. Respondent has used the filings to further harass, injure, alarm, defraud and negatively impact financially, the City, and city officials, employees and Municipal Judge.

15. Respondent's conduct constitutes a Class C Felony under Section 570.095 RSMo given the identity of the victims.

17. Pursuant to Section 570.095.8, Petitioner is entitled to a hearing within 20 business days of the date this Petition is filed with the Court.

18. Pursuant to Section 570.095, Respondent is responsible for court costs and fees and restitution to the Petitioner.

GRAND JURY ISSUES INDICTMENT AGAINST LADUE RESIDENT FOR RUNNING OVER WEIDMAN ROAD RESIDENT AFTER SMASHING HIS GARAGE DOOR WITH HER CAR We reported this in our January 11 newsletter when the Ladue woman was first charged for going to the wrong house and trying to kill the homeowner. Below is the Grand Jury indictment issued last week.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Town and Country police responded to a residence at 908 Weidman Road for a report that a female suspect was ramming the garage doors of the residence. On arrival they located victim, lying on the driveway in front of the garage, suffering from severe injuries. Victim was transported to the hospital and diagnosed with a fractured skull with a brain bleed, a broken arm and other internal injuries. The vehicle used by the suspect (a Genesis SUV) was left behind at the scene. A paramedic who arrived to treat victim said they had seen a white female walking into a nearby wooded area. Police located defendant, matching the description, in the wooded area. She admitted that she had been present at the house and said she had gone there to kill another man (not victim). In addition to the damage to the house, defendant's vehicle had also damaged a work vehicle in the possession of victim.

Several councilpersons have refused to say what bill was being voted on in closed session ref 16150 Main Circle Dr. in fear of being removed from the Council.

First this appears to be in conflict with a little something called THE FIRST AMENDMENT.

You were apparently on the job in 2023 when the bill was passed that includes this:

67. ~~Rule 7.~~ Any person in attendance at an executive session is honor-bound not to violate the confidentiality of the discussion taking place during the session, except as to any portions thereof which may clearly transgress the Sunshine Act. Violation of this subsection may be cause for removal pursuant to RSMo 77.340.

Let's go to 77-340

77.340. May remove officer with consent of council. — The mayor may, with the consent of a majority of all the members elected to the city council, remove from office, for cause shown, any elective officer of the city, such officer being first given opportunity, together with his witnesses, to be heard before the council, sitting as a court of impeachment. Any elective officer may, in like manner, for cause shown, be removed from office by a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to the city council, independently of the mayor's approval or recommendation. The mayor may, with the consent of a majority of all the members elected to the council, remove from office any appointive officer of the city at will; and any such appointive officer may be so removed by a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to the council, independently of the mayor's approval or recommendation. The council may pass ordinances regulating the manner of impeachment and removals.

So clearly one is not just kicked off the council, but instead has to be impeached and open to Court review. This isn't for saying what the topic is in a closed meeting, but is for ANYTHING.

I understand why discussions in a closed meeting should remain secret, but an elected official saying a bill was voted on seems to be more than justified and is the public's right to know under the Sunshine Law.

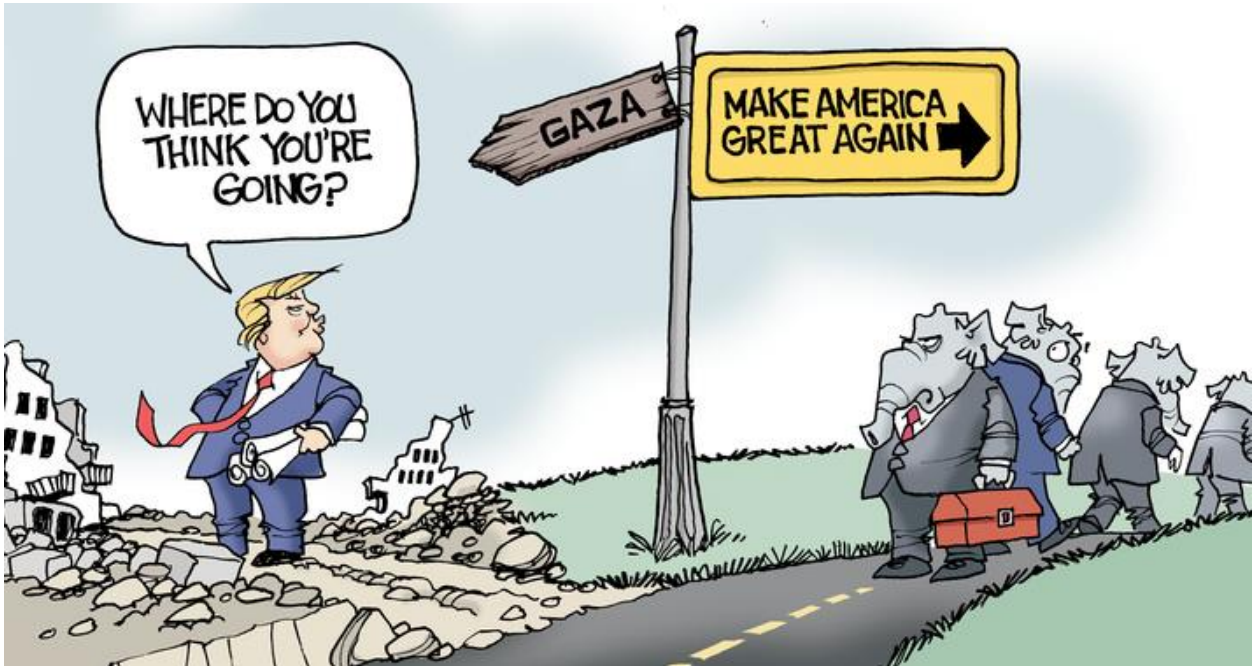
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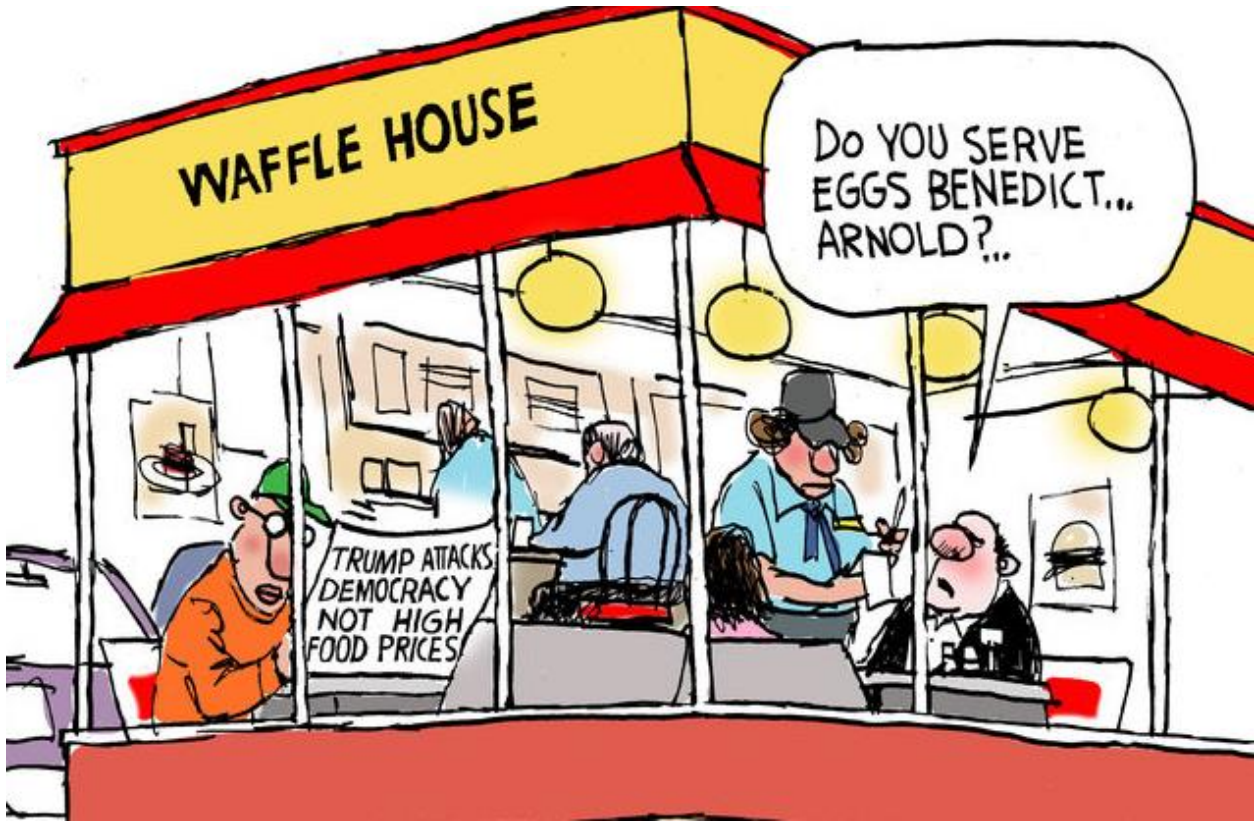


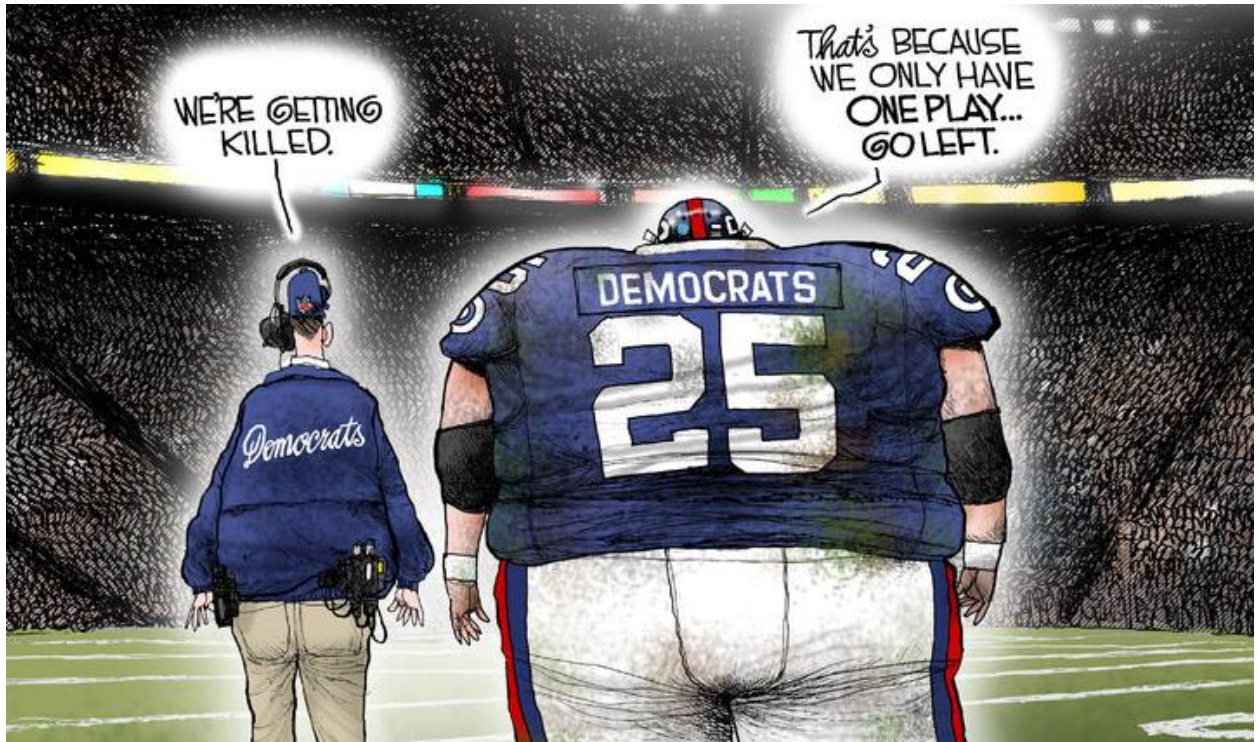
