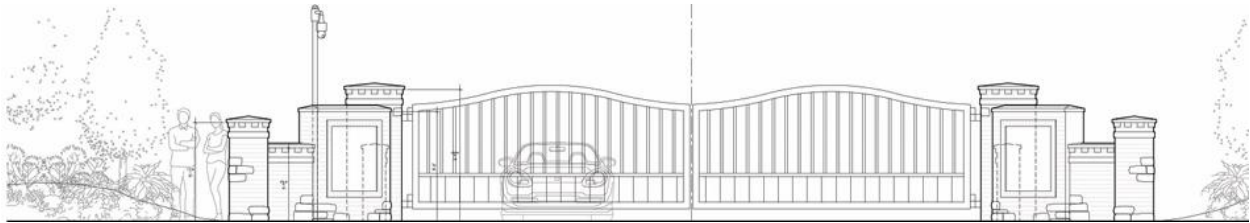

Officers also conducted traffic stops and provided patrols of businesses, neighborhoods, and parks.

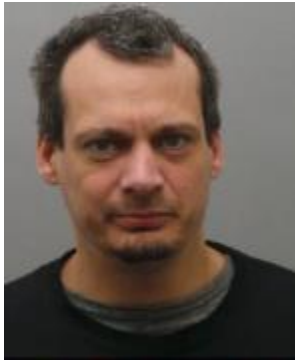

I, Timothy Campbell, DSN 0377, Chesterfield Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 25653. I have probable cause to believe that on February 16, 2025, within St. Louis County, Anaya Spears, Black, Female, 5'00", 115lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01	DOMESTIC ASSAULT - 3RD DEGREE - CLASS E FELONY
Count: 02	UNLAWFUL USE OF WEAPON - SUBSECTION 4 - EXHIBITING - CLASS E FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Victim and Defendant had previously been in a relationship and have two children in common. Victim was staying the night at Defendant's residence. Victim went through Defendant's phone and Defendant and Victim got into a heated argument. Defendant attempted to punch Victim multiple time but missed. Victim attempted to create space between Victim and Defendant by reaching out his right forearm. Defendant then bit Victim on the right forearm. Victim then went into the bathroom and Defendant went into the Kitchen and grabbed a knife. When Victim exited the bathroom, Defendant began swinging the knife at Victim and chasing Victim around the apartment with the knife. Victim then ran into the bathroom, locked himself inside and called 911 for assistance. When Police Officers arrived they observed puncture wounds and bite marks on Victim's forearm. The knife that

Defendant used was laying out on the kitchen counter top. Defendant admitted to grabbing the knife and swinging at the victim four or five times.

I believe that the defendant poses a danger to a crime victim because of the nature and circumstances of the charges.

He is running for City Council in Ward 2.

His address used to file for Council is 200 Ambridge Court Unit 205. Tax records show the address, a condo, has been under his and his wife's name for two years.

He has no cars listed on St. Louis County Tax Records. He last had cars listed on Warren County tax records in 2017 at 671 Whitetail Creek Drive in Innsbrook.

This is an action against St. Louis County Collector Jake Zimmerman by Smith claiming he was not a resident of St. Louis County, but a resident of Warren County living at 671 Whitetail Creek Drive in Innsbrook, Warren County. It was found in favor of Smith that he was not a St. Louis County resident.

The decision of the Board of Equalization of St. Louis County (BOE) sustaining the assessment made by Respondent Jake Zimmerman, Assessor, St. Louis County, (Respondent) is SET ASIDE. Complainant Andrew G. Smith (Complainant) presented substantial and persuasive evidence to rebut the presumption of correct assessment by the BOE and establishing that the tax situs of his personal property and business personal property on January 1, 2016, was Warren County, not St. Louis County.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. **Jurisdiction.** Jurisdiction over this appeal is proper. Complainant timely appealed to the STC.
2. **Evidentiary Hearing.** The issue of tax situs (residence) was presented at an evidentiary hearing on February 1, 2017, in Division 8 of the 21st Judicial Circuit at the St. Louis County Courthouse in Clayton, Missouri. At the evidentiary hearing, along with their pre-filed exhibits and evidence, both Complainant and Respondent presented the testimony of several witnesses.
3. **Identification of Subject Property.** Complainant's personal property is identified by account number I00596180. Complainant's business personal property is identified by account number B0065555A. (Exhibit H; Exhibit I)
4. **Description of Subject Property.** The personal property consists of one 2006 Subaru Forester Wagon. (Exhibit G; St. Louis County Assessor Property Database) The business personal property consists of miscellaneous office furniture and computer hardware. (St. Louis County Assessor Personal Property Record Card; St. Louis County Assessor Property Database)
5. **Assessment.** Respondent valued Complainant's personal property at \$1,330 and valued Complainant's business personal property at \$500 as of January 1, 2016.
6. **Board of Equalization.** The BOE did not provide a substantive decision on Complainant's appeal, which had the effect of sustaining Respondent.
7. **Complainant's Evidence.** To support Complainant's claim that St. Louis County was not the proper tax situs for his personal property and business personal property on the

ground that Complainant was not a resident of St. Louis County on January 1, 2016, Complainant offered the following as evidence:

Complainant's Testimony

Complainant testified that he was divorced and living in an apartment in St. Louis County during 1995. Complainant testified that, in December 1995, he bought a home in Warren County, 671

Whitetail Creek Drive, Innsbrook, Missouri, (the Warren County home) "with the full intent to establish [his] domicile in Warren County." (Tr. 9-10) Complainant testified that, in January 1996, he filed a declaration of personal property with the Warren County Assessor's Office. Complainant testified that he reported to St. Louis County on its declaration form that he had moved out of St. Louis County as of December 1995. (Tr. 10) Complainant testified that, also in January 1996, he established his voting residence in Warren County and removed himself from the voting rolls of St. Louis County and that his voting residence "continues in Warren County to this day." (Id.) Complainant testified that he is a sole proprietor (tax lawyer), not a corporation or other legal entity, and that his private practice has been located in St. Louis County since prior to 1995. (Id.) Complainant testified that he changed his "domicile" from St. Louis County to Warren County in 1995 and that for 18 years the assessors of both Warren County and St. Louis County recognized Complainant's "domicile" as Warren County for purposes of ad valorem taxation of his personal property and business personal property. (Id.)

Complainant testified that, in 2014, Wendy Nordwald (Nordwald), the current assessor for Warren County, informed Respondent that Complainant had changed his "domicile" to St. Louis County, which Respondent accepted. (Id.) Complainant testified that this change was in error and that he made phone calls and wrote letters to both Nordwald and Respondent and presented evidence of his residence in Warren County to no avail. (Id.) Complainant testified that he purchased his vehicle in 2006 and that it is registered in Warren County. Complainant further testified that his driver's license is addressed in Warren County; that he attends movies, fireworks displays, plays, and concerts in Warren County; that he worships at either Holy Rosary or Harmony Church in Warren County; that his bank has branches in Warren County; that he plays golf, swims, walks, watches birds, fishes, watches television, socializes, reads, explores, and plays games in Warren County; and that he always returns to his home in Warren County. (Tr. 12)

ORDER

On January 1, 2016, Complainant was not a resident, as the term is used in Section 137.090.1, of St. Louis County. Consequently, the proper tax situs of Complainant's personal property and business personal property on January 1, 2016, was Warren County, not St. Louis County. The decision of the BOE is SET ASIDE.¹⁶¹

the parking garage and outside parking spaces. The reason is that parking for the nearby City's outdoor amphitheater is very sparse and not enough for parking at events.

Our first suggestion is to offer to buy the parking garage and outside space, renting them back to the office building owner at \$1 a year, with the understanding parking spaces will be available for amphitheater events.



Our second suggestion is that we hear Mayor Bob Nation, who is completely opposed to the city entering the office management business and is not happy that residents don't know what is going on. The mayor is not running for reelection. He should 1) stop holding closed meetings 2) at a meeting publicly say what has been going on with the stupid idea of buying a 5-story office building for additional parking and who is behind it. If the Council decides to impeach him, they will not have enough time before his term ends.

you are charged with DWI or recommend the judge sends the drunk driver to a diversion program that ends with no record at all.

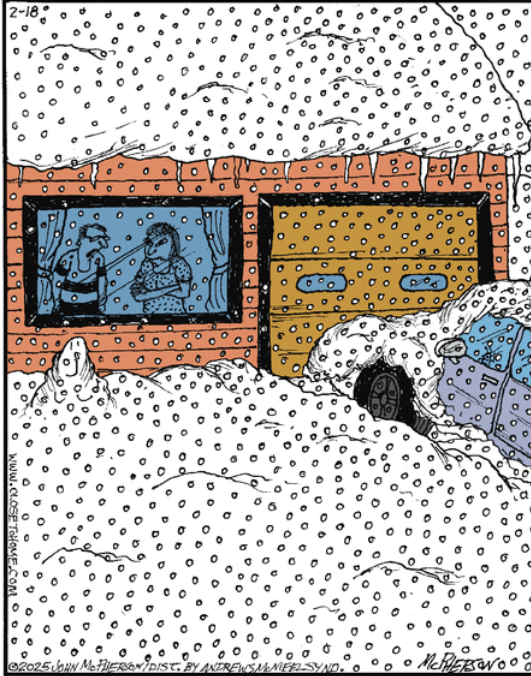
