GRAND JURY INDICTMENT ON A DATE GONE BAD. MARYVILLE FEMALE STUDENT FINDS OUT WHY NOT TO DATE COMPUTER CONTACTS: Here is the indictment:

- 1 - Harassment - 1st Degree
- 2 - Tampering With Physical Evidence In Felony Prosecution
- 3 - Tampering With A Witness In A Felony Prosecution

I, Katie Exline, DSN 0123, Town and Country Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 23-1159. I have probable cause to believe that between October 9, 2023 and November 5, 2023, within St. Louis County, [*include all dates and locations*], Lorenzo Gaines, Black, Male, 5'04", 173lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01	HARASSMENT - 1ST DEGREE - CLASS E FELONY
Count: 02	TAMPERING WITH PHYSICAL EVIDENCE IN FELONY PROSECUTION - CLASS E FELONY
Count: 03	TAMPERING WITH A WITNESS IN A FELONY PROSECUTION - CLASS D FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Victim, a college student, and defendant, met online on or between October 1 and October 3, 2023, and hung out a few times at the college hall and each of their residences. On October 9, 2023, they got into a disagreement over text messages, and victim told defendant they should stop speaking. Defendant then called the victim 102 times on her cell phone, through Instagram, Face Timed her, and texted her. Victim told him to stop calling her and blocked him on all social media. Defendant began using other numbers to try and communicate with her. Defendant then texted victim that he would break

into her school to see her, and attempted to contact her through her friends when she blocked him. On October 11, 2023, defendant texted victim, "you know we have a sex tape", sending her a screen shot of a recording with a date and time coinciding with times they were together. Victim then blocked his phone number. Victim then received other texts threatening to post the video. On October 12, 2023, defendant was interviewed by officers. Upon being interviewed, post-miranda, he explained to officers why he was upset, made a statement confirming "ok that is harassment", admitted to using other phone numbers to try and communicate with her, confessed to sending the text threatening to post the video, and consented to officers searching his devices. After denying a video existed at first, he later stated to police a video did exist, but he deleted it when he put in his password to allow officers to look at his iPad. On October 14, 2023, victim received texts begging her to "drop charges" stating defendant would pay her \$1,000 and would do anything.

Defendant tried to make contact with victim multiple times after this, and on November 5, 2023, defendant sent multiple texts to victim confessing to the harassment. Defendant has prior arrests for domestic assault and possession of child pornography, prior for stalking, and has an active order of protection against him from another female.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE TWO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENTS WITH NAVIGATE BUILDING SOLUTIONS FOR DESIGN, PRE-CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT, AND ADDITIONAL CONSULTANT SERVICES ASSOCIATED WITH BOTH THE PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING PROJECT AND THE MUNICIPAL CENTER AND FIRE HOUSE RENOVATION PROJECT

Section 1. There is hereby approved a Professional Services Agreement (“Agreement A”)with Navigate Building Solutions for design and consultant services associated with the Public Works Building Project in the amount of **\$58,223**. A copy of said Agreement, with a detailed scope of services to include site visits, program development, and preparation of cost opinion, pre-construction and budget management, etc. is attached hereto as Exhibit “A” and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. There is hereby approved a Professional Services Agreement (“Agreement B”)with Navigate Building Solutions for design and consultant services associated with the Municipal Center and Fire House Renovation Project, in the amount of **\$99,735.28**. A copy of said agreement, with a detailed scope of services to include consultant procurement services, pre-construction and budget management, reporting, etc. is attached hereto as Exhibit “B” and incorporated herein by this reference

Both these spending bills passed on a 8-0 vote with no debate.

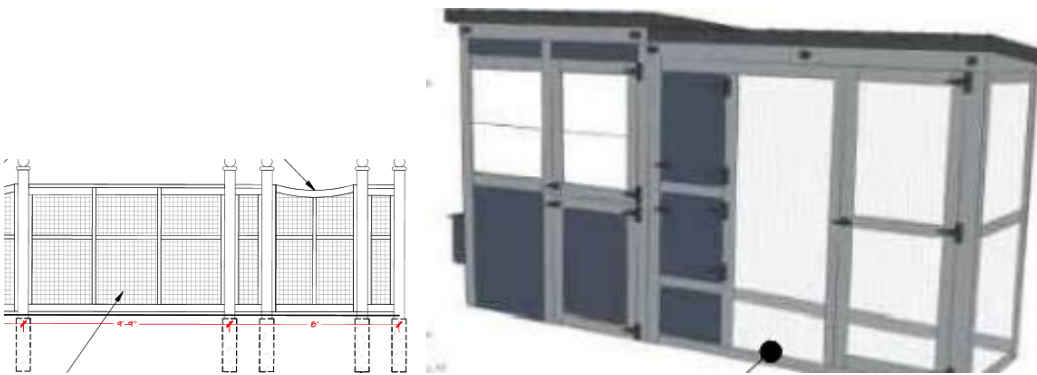

The Town Square is very nice compared to the closed gas station it replaced on nine acres. However, former Mayor Jon Dalton did not seem the least bit concerned when it came to spending most of the city's budget reserve on the project that went \$5,000,000 over budget. CHICKEN COOP APPROVED The Board approved a chicken coop for up to 4 hens at 8 Lochinvar Lane off Mason Road on a 8-0 vote. Before the vote Mayor Dr. Charles Rehm lectured that the chance of Avian Flu would be remote. However, it was brought up if the homeowner hired a company that tends other chicken coops that chances of Avian Flu would rise.

SENATE BILL TO REMOVE FOOD FROM SALES TAX: After the agenda items were dealt with Ald. Sue Allen spoke of Missouri Senate Bill 57 going to committee. The bill if passed would remove food from Sales Taxes. Since Town and Country has a limited amount of retail, the Schunks Supermarket, Whole Foods, Straubs and Target produce a lot of sales tax revenue on food purchases. If the State Legislature got rid of sales tax on food homeowners recently dealing with a City real estate tax, would see that zoom upwards to continue police, fire and parks services.

If our elected officials plan to obligate the City to purchase the building, will there be a termination penalty to back out of the deal if newly elected leadership decide the purchase is not prudent?

As Mayor, these are some of the questions I would like to see discussed transparently, with input and feedback from the citizens of Chesterfield.
