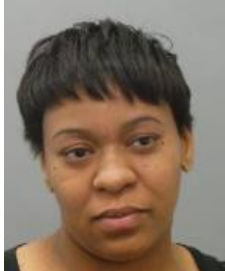

FRIDAY MARCH 14, 2025 AFTERNOON-EVENING WATCH STORMY STORMEY NIGHT

Throughout the shift high winds caused many issues with downed trees blocking roadways and falling on power lines causing power outages and fires. The weather picked up around 2100 hrs consisting of heavy rain, hail and tornado warnings. At one point it was believed a tornado may be traveling through the valley causing all officers to take shelter and suspend calls for service temporarily.

After the severe storms and possible tornadoes traveled through the city, officers along with the fire department responded to multiple fires due to downed powerlines and blown transformers along with many roadways blocked due to downed trees.

A substantial part of the city lost power with most of it still out at the time of this report.

While not responding to calls for service, officers drove throughout the city checking for residents needing assistance. In the area of Hidden Oak and Cedar Creek, off of Appalachian Trail, officers located houses with structural damage due to downed trees. Available officers went door-to-door checking on residents. Officers advised that it appears a tornado may have touched down in this area.

At the time of this report, officers have South Woods Mill Rd, in front of Parkway Central high, closed due to two utility poles snapped on both sides of the roadway and power lines on the ground. White Road and Conway are closed due to trees over the roadway.

Officers also responded to calls for service to include alarms, citizen contacts, suspicious activity, motor vehicle crashes, motorist assists, vehicle lockout, 911 hang up, suspicious vehicle, traffic hazards, parking violation, sick cases, subject stuck in an elevator, disturbance and a check the welfare.

Officers also conducted traffic stops and provided patrols of businesses, neighborhoods, and parks.

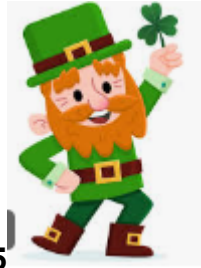

CHESTERFIELD UNDERCOVER DETECTIVE ARRESTS FERGUSON WOMAN FOR THEFT SCHEME AND RECOVERS STOLEN PROPERTY: From KTVI news website:

CHESTERFIELD, Mo. – A years-long retail theft scheme unraveled when an undercover Chesterfield police officer posing as a buyer exposed a Ferguson woman selling stolen goods on Facebook, leading to the seizure of more than \$25,000 worth of merchandise.

Chesterfield police were tipped off about suspicious online activity, where a woman was selling new clothing for steep discounts on Facebook Marketplace.

Tyisha Acoff, now facing a felony charge of receiving stolen property, was arrested after police linked her online sales to a string of thefts at multiple local retail stores.

Starting back in November, investigators quickly established a pattern: her car had been spotted at or near the scenes of reported thefts, and the merchandise she was selling closely matched stolen inventory from the same stores such as Nike and Ulta.

An undercover officer posing as a customer met Acoff at her Ferguson home and purchased \$150 worth of brand-new clothing for just \$40. During the sting operation, the officer noted piles of retail merchandise, many items still with tags, scattered throughout the home.

The following day, police executed a search warrant, uncovering an extensive stash of stolen goods, including clothing, accessories, and a large stock of detached security tags.

When officers took Acoff into custody, she reportedly admitted to the scheme, telling them, “I know why y’all here, it’s because of me boostin’.”

“Boosting is just concealing items without paying for them and reselling them. It looks like today’s method is social media and it looked like she was fairly successful,” Sgt. Robert Powell, a Chesterfield Police Department spokesman, said.

Police said Acoff confessed to working with others and said the operation had been running for years. Now, authorities continue investigating the full scope of the retail theft ring.

“Trust us to do our jobs and this is a highlight of what can happen when the community reaches out to its police department,” Powell said.

Below is the Warrant Probable Cause Statement by a Chesterfield Officer

I, Stephen Gorczyca, DSN 0350, Chesterfield Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true and documented in report number 24-5505. I have probable cause to believe that on January 9, 2025, within St. Louis County, Tyisha Acoff, Black, Female, 5'10", 200lbs, committed one or more criminal offense(s).

Count: 01 RECEIVING STOLEN PROPERTY - CLASS C FELONY

The facts supporting this belief are as follows: Chesterfield police were alerted, through a confidential informant, that defendant was selling a large quantity of stolen merchandise through her Facebook page. Subsequent investigation showed a strong correlation between documented thefts at various retail outlets; the presence of a vehicle registered to defendant at or near the location of those thefts; and merchandise, consistent with that stolen in the thefts, being offered for sale promptly thereafter on defendant's Facebook page. Chesterfield police contacted defendant via Facebook, posing as an interested buyer, and arranged the purchase of several items of clothing from defendant's residence in Ferguson. An undercover officer arrived and purchased the merchandise, which had a total retail value of \$149.79, for \$40. The officer noted that, while he was inside the house, he saw a large quantity of other retail merchandise spread out on a table. Police obtained a search warrant for defendant's residence and executed it the next day. Defendant was present and was taken into custody. She spontaneously told police "I know why y'all here, it's because of me boostin'." A large quantity of clothing and other retail merchandise was seized from the residence. Most of the items still had price tags attached to them, and police found a substantial quantity of security sensors that had been detached from the items of merchandise. The total value of the merchandise seized was determined to be at least \$25,044.28. Defendant confessed to stealing, along with others, and that she had been engaged in that activity for several years.

This is clearly staying a step ahead of the issues the City of St. Louis is dealing with of homeless living in parks and green space next to road. The ordinance allows just six-hours of “camping” with city permission. The matter will be voted on at the next Council meeting on April 22.

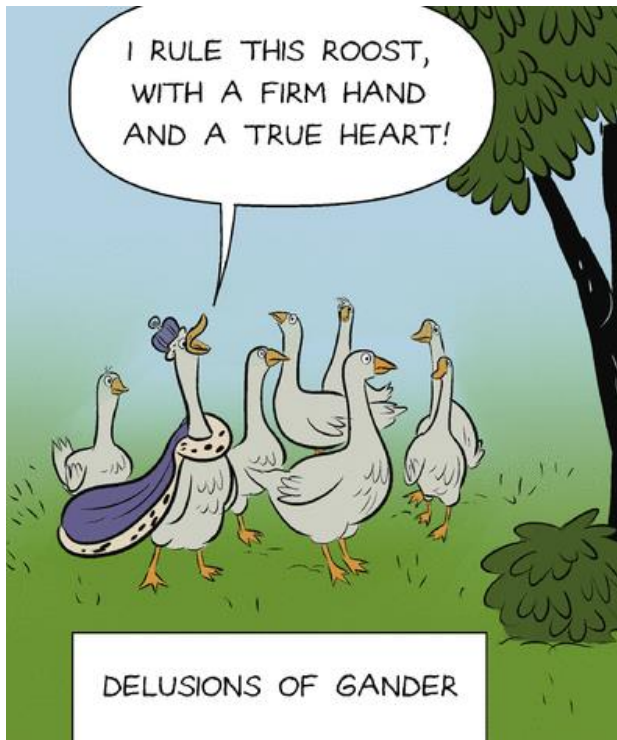
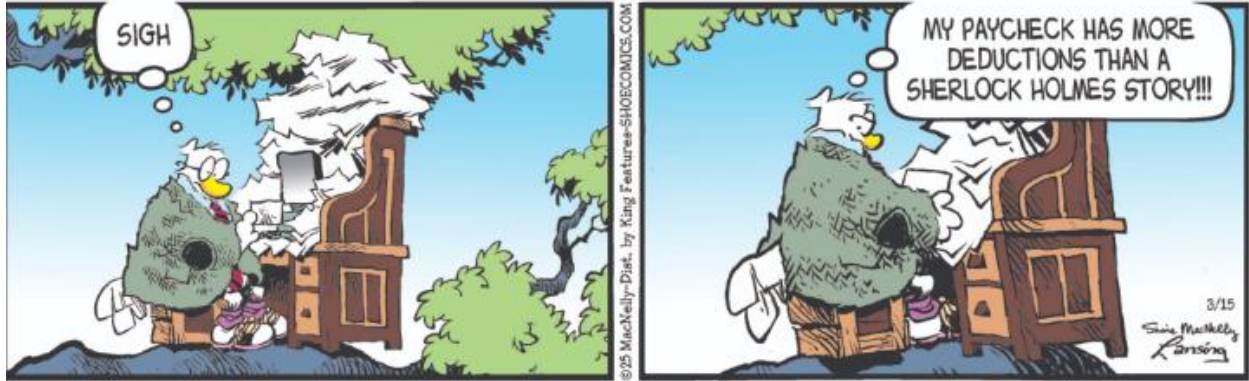

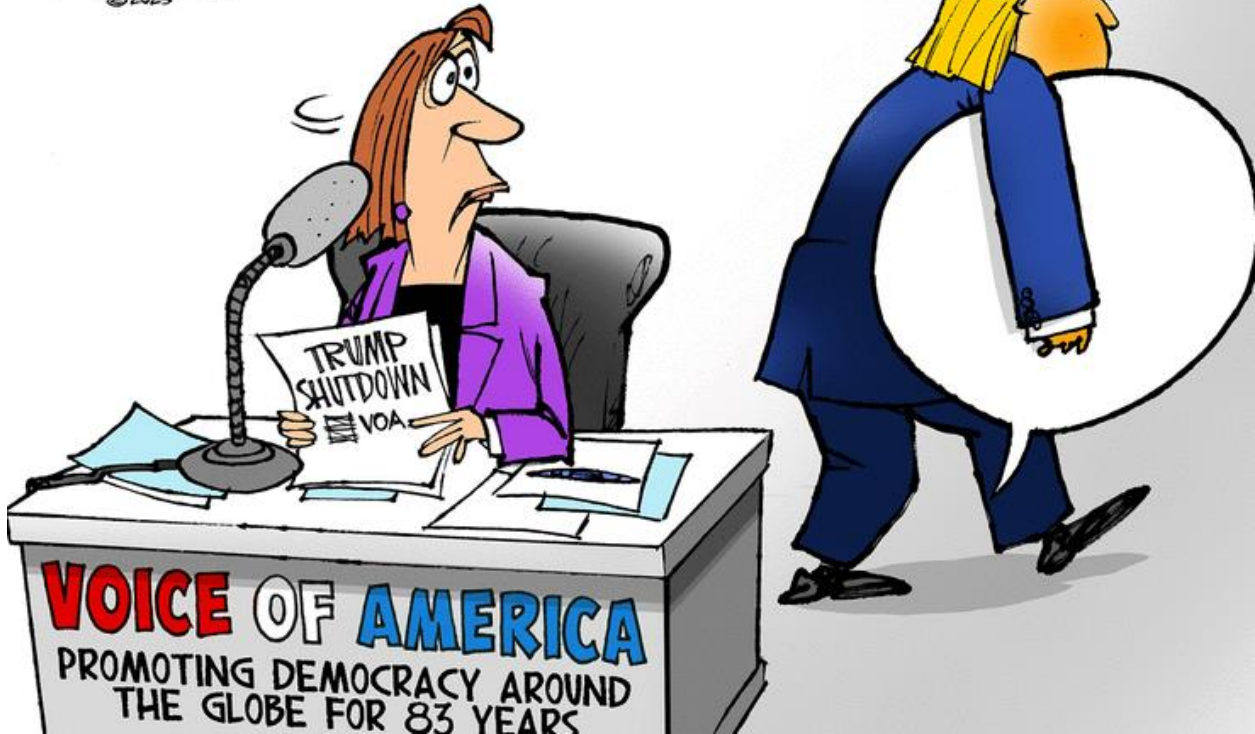
