HOW WERE THERE NO CITATIONS AND A SHUT DOWN OF MINEO'S? Last week we wrote how the Liquor License for John Mineo's Restaurant had been NINE MONTHS expired. Something smells rotten here. The Board of Aldermen voted to renew the license until July 1, 2025.

The owner/manager of the restaurant John Mineo, Jr. served Federal Prison time in 2008 for a mortgage fraud with former Vashon High School basketball coach Floyd Irons and Michael Noll. Besides the prison time Mineo making Mineo unable to have a liquor license, he was ordered to make \$1,000,000 in restitution received in the fraud.

The owner and founder of the restaurant, John Mineo died in 2020. The liquor was then in the name of Mineo, Jr.'s mother Anna, who died in 2022. The signature on the current liquor license renewal is of Ardian Hoxhaj, a college student.

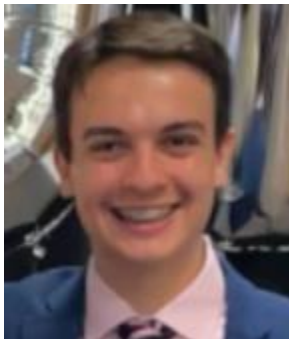
This brought about the following questions:

One) When the liquor license was not renewed in July of 2024, why didn't the Fianace Department notify the police who could have a detective go into the restaurant, see that liquor was being served and issue a citation and shut down the bar?

Two) When the liquor license application came in NINE months late, why weren't citations issued? Why was the liquor service allowed to continue until the license renewal was approved by the Alderpersons on March 24.

Three) How is Ardian Hoxhaj connected to the management of Mineo's. His Facebook was established on March 22 and only show a photo of Mineo's restaurant...nothing else. His LinkedIn page makes no mention of Mineo's but does mention he was a bagger at Schnucks for three years. He is an accounting major at St. Louis University and expects to get his degree in 2026. He says he has been accepted as an intern for an accounting company in 2026.

There is no mention in his LinkedIn posting of working at Mineo's.

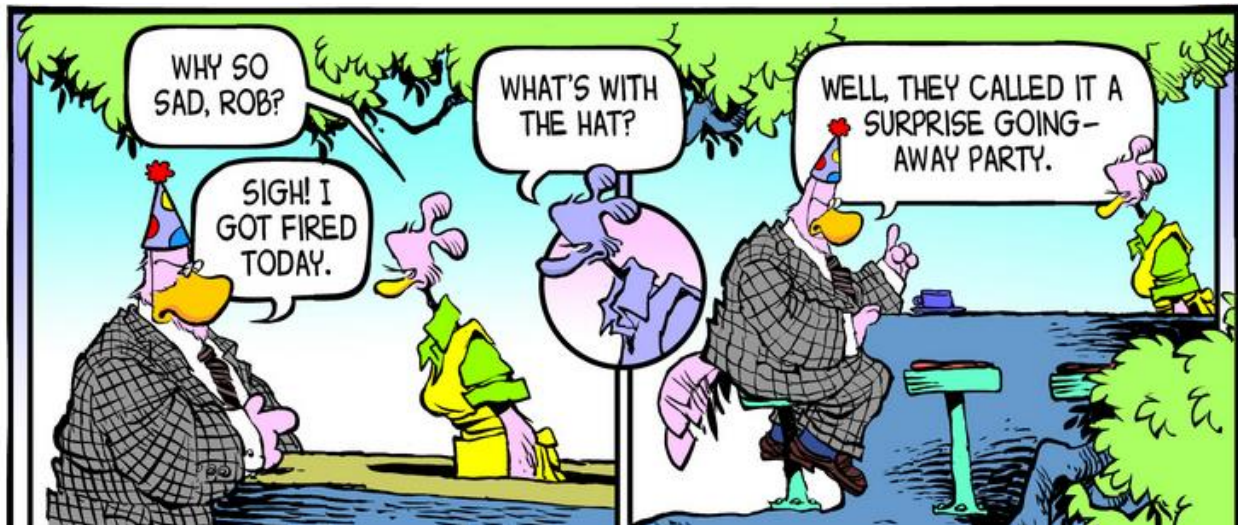
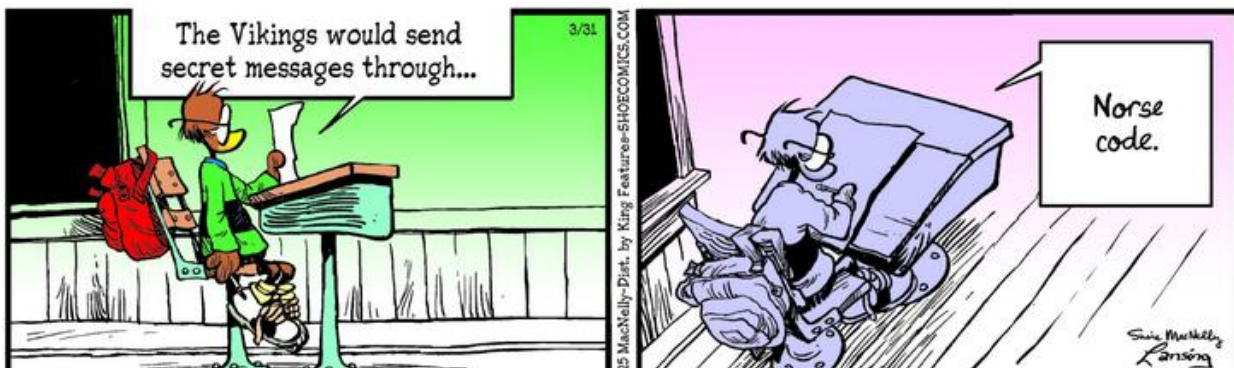
