

DOING 92 MPH IN A 45 ZONE ON WILD HORSE CREEK ROAD IS SURE TO GET A COP'S ATTENTION. On Friday afternoon June 14, 2019 at 5:32pm Chesterfield Police Officer Matt Adams was driving east on Wild Horse Creek Road when he encountered a Ford Edge approaching him going west at a very high rate of speed.

Officer Adams' radar unit clocked the Ford doing 92 mph in the 45 mph zone. Officer Adams turned on his red lights and siren, turned around and followed the Ford into a subdivision. The driver was still speeding.

He finally stopped and started to get out of his car, causing Officer Adams to order him back into the car. He refused to go back into the car and Officer Adams handcuffed him. The driver, who did not have hits drivers' license with him, was **David Scott Lindemann**, 30 of Sullivan, Missouri. It was clear that Lindemann had been drinking.

He had stopped on Wilmas Farm Drive in front of a house under construction. His brother was at the construction site.

Lindemann stated that he was speeding after he was cut off at a stop light and was trying to catch up to the car. "There was a guy in front of me that tried to cut me off at the fucking stoplight," said Lindemann.

He was placed in the backseat of the police car and then said, "this guy is acting as erratic as fuck," apparently referring to Officer Adams.

Once an assisting officer arrived Lindemann was taken out of the police car and the handcuffs were removed. He then failed field sobriety tests. A field breath test showed his BAC level at .088%. It was going up.

In plain view from outside of Lindemann's Ford, Officer Adams could see eight empty Fireball Whiskey shot bottles on the front floorboard and on the console.



Back in the police car Lindemann said, "You are really overreacting sir." Officer Adams asked if doing 92 in a 45 is overreacting. That is when Lindemann stated the following:

"I don't want to tell on myself. It's the story of my fucking life. I can't give myself a break."

Lindemann said he failed to stop for the siren and flashing lights on the police car because he was 45 minute late in picking up his brother.

Once at the police station Lindemann agreed to take an "official" breath test that show his BAC level was now .09%.

This is from the police report of Lindemann's condition and attitude:

After the breath test Lindemann agreed to be interviewed. He admitted that he thought he was intoxicated. He said he had been drinking four Fireball shots over an hour before being stopped. This is from the police report:

I, Officer Alexander Stephens #556, with O'Fallon Missouri Police Department, a law enforcement agency, state that the facts contained herein are true to my best knowledge and belief and that any false statements made are punishable by law.

On 05/19/2024, within O'Fallon, in St. Charles County, MO, David S. Lindemann did:

Commit the crime of DWI-Alcohol Aggravated Offender, Driving While Suspended, Possess Open Container of Alcohol within Vehicle.

At approximately 2010 hours, I responded to assist on a traffic stop involving the driver and sole occupant, David S. Lindemann. Lindemann was actively operating the motor vehicle prior to the stop and still positioned within the driver's seat with the vehicle still running.

An open container with alcohol inside was observed in the center cup holder area as we a strong odor of intoxicants emanating from his person as he spoke. David admitted to consuming alcohol at an earlier time which consisted of five (5) to six (6) shots of whiskey.

David consented to conducting Standardized Field Sobriety Tests as well as providing a breath sample for the Portable Breathalyzer Test.

Upon conducting the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, I observed four (4) clues of the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test, five clues (5) of the Walk and Turn test, and three clues (3) of the One Leg Stand test. The Portable Breathalyzer Test result showed a BrAC of .213.

Additionally, a breath sample was provided per Missouri Implied Consent which showed a BrAC of .193.

CHESTERFIELD OUTCOME: On 04/25/23 Lindemann in Chesterfield City Court pled guilty to a Parking Vio which had been Fail to Yield to Emg Vehicle. He was fined \$150. He pled guilty to Unregistered Vehicle and was fine \$50. He pled guilty to the Speeding 92/45 charge and was fined \$300.

The Felony DWI charge resulted in a Guilty Plea on 10/07/22 and Lindemann was placed on a SES Probation term.

Five months after the Lindemann arrest Officer Matt Adams received an award from MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) for the DWI arrests he has made.

TWO WOMAN SHOPLIFTERS STEALING AT NIKE LEAVE STORE AND SEE POLICE OFFICERS COMING TOWARD THEM. THEY THEN WALK INTO COACH STORE TO UNLOAD STOLEN GOODS:

Special Enforcement Officers received a call on November 9, 2019 at 8:24pm from the manager of the Nike Store in the Chesterfield Vallery Premium Outlet Mall that two black woman were in the store stealing. He said it appeared as if one was acting as a lookout while the other was stealing shoes.



Officer Jason Bromwich and two other officers arrived and were outside when the women with the loot left the store. The two saw two officers and immediately turned around and saw the third officer. They then entered the Coach store. There the manager told officers he saw a woman later identified as **Quinesha Lewis** take a pair of shoes from under her coat and hide them on a shelf.

The shoes were \$119 pair of women's Air Vapor Max.

A search of Lewis by Mall Security revealed she was carrying a small pry tool and a magnet used to deactivate theft sensors.

Lewis and the second woman, **Gregreonia Hampton** were arrested. Lewis gave officers a false name and was later identified through fingerprints. She had three outstanding theft warrants from Chesterfield. Lewis had been arrested for Felony Stealing at the Nike Store in St. Peters in 2015.

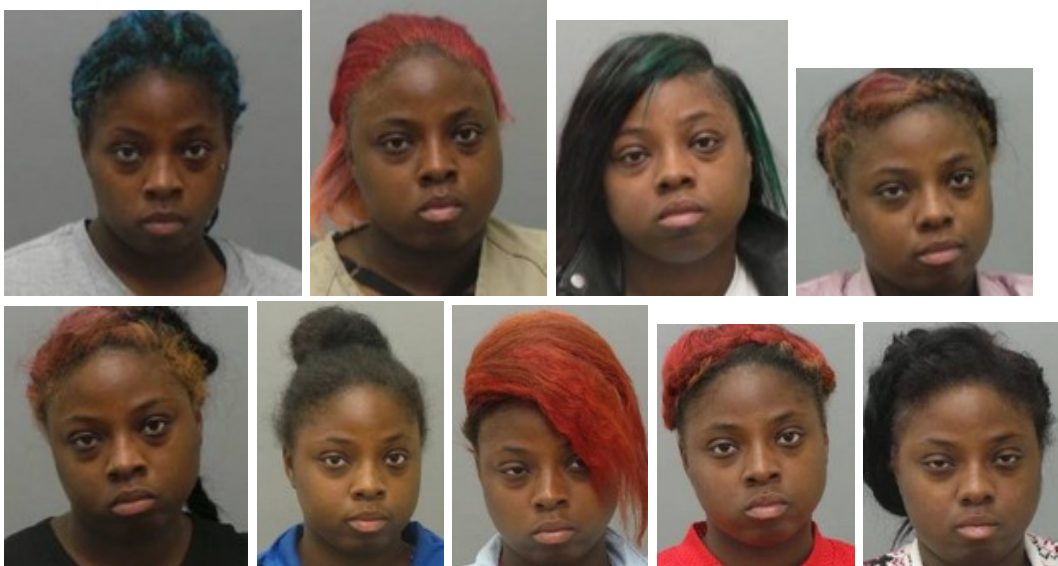

CHESTERFIELD OUTCOME: Hampton pled guilty to stealing in 2019 and was sentence to 10-days jail on 01/30/24 ref her two 2019 Stealing arrests.

CHESTERFIELD WAL MART EMPLOYEE PISSED AT CUSTOMER PARKING IN A PICKUP ZONE ONLY AND KEYED HER CAR CAUSING \$913 IN DAMAGE

On Monday afternoon January 20, 2020 at about 2:15 a woman drove into the "Grocery Pickup Lane Only" (Covid response for people calling in orders) at the Chesterfield Wal Mart store and parked her 2019 Mercedes Benz SUV, exited the car and walked toward the doors to the store.

She was confronted by a Wal Mart employee who told her she could not park in the pickup lane. She ignored him.

When she returned to the car she found a long deep scratch down the left rear door.



Wal Mart management viewed an outside security video and observed that employee **Terry Linhardt, 71**, was seen lowering his body and swiping something against the left door. Linhardt, a retiree with engineering degrees from Washinton University and SIUE worked at Wal Mart as a system engineer for 7 years.

Linhardt admitted to the store manager “keying” the car saying he was upset by the encounter and made a bad decision. He also made the admission to Chesterfield Police Officer Devin Holroyd. Linhardt was issued a citation for Destruction of Property.

OUTCOME: Linhardt has no other record of offenses or traffic violations. On June 14, 2021 he appeared in Chesterfield Municipia Court without a defense attorney and pled guilty. He was \$250.

63-YEAR OLD MAN ARRESTED AT WAL MART FOR STEALING A COMPUTER HIDDEN IN A PLASTIC CABINET On Thursday October 28. 2021 a Chesterfield Police Officer responder to a theft in progress at the Wal Mart store in Chesterfield Valley.

Wal Mart security had observed a man take a plastic chest of drawers, go to the electronic department and place a \$429 computer in the chest. Security watched the suspect take the items to the rear of the toy department where he removed the security devices. Chesterfield Police officers were waiting for him as he exited the store.

He was identified as Kenneth Hosiah Lewis, 63, of St. Louis. He was arrested and taken to the store’s security office before being transported to the police station.

Lewis had more than four prior stealing convictions and was booked for Felony Stealing and on a City Ordinance for Trespassing.

CHESTERFIELD OUTCOME: Lewis pled guilty in State Court to Felony stealing on 09/23/22 and was sentenced to 90-days jail. After failing to appear on the Trespassing Charge four times in Chesterfield Court he pled guilty on 04/16/24 and fined \$250.

CHESTERFIELD POLICE OFFICER WAITS FOR THIEF TO EXIT WAL MART WITH A SHOPPING CART OF STOLEN ITEMS

On Wednesday November 24, 2021 Chesterfield Officers responded to a report of a suspect about to push a shopping cart with stolen items out of the Wal Mart store. Officer Lantz was the first to arrive and was in the security office watching the suspect who had placed a vacuum cleaner and cellphone in the shopping cart, then moved from the merchandise checkout lane to the grocery side of the store.

Officer Lantz advised Officer Kyle Hahn, who was just arriving to stay outside of the store and wait for the suspect to exit. The suspect walked out of the store pushing the cart onto the parking lot when he saw the police car and Officer Hahn. He let go of the cart and continued to walk, only to have Officer Hahn catch up with him and order him to stop.

After handcuffing the suspect, Benjamin Lillard, 32, , a check of the shopping cart revealed a Eufy Robovac valued at \$249 and a \$59 T-Mobile cellphone.

This wasn't Lillard first time stealing cellphones. In July of 2013 he burglarized a house in St/ Charles, stole a cellphone with a GPS app that the police were able to track. It led them to a house in St. Charles County where Lillard was hiding in the attic with the stolen cellphone and a stolen handgun from another burglary. He was sentenced to 10-years in prison.

LILLARD ARRESTED FOR THEFTS FROM HOME DEPOT: On July 14, 2022 police were call about three more thefts. Lillard was back stealing in Chesterfield. This time he was at Home Depot on April 30, 2022, May 25, 2022 and May 29, 2022. Home Depot Security was slow in reporting the thefts. They received a be on the outlook for Lillard from their Manchester Store and on checking surveillance video saw him stealing.

Among the items stolen by Lillard were a chain saw, lawn mower and more totaling \$2,588. Lillard was trying to sell the items on his facebook page. Officers called his phone trying to get him to turn himself in but got no answers. Lillard was entered into the police computer system as WANTED by the Chesterfield PD for felonies.

On July 18, 2022 Lillard was arrested by St. Louis County Officers in Jennings. He was picked up and declined to make any statements. Felony Warrants were issued by the County Prosecutor's Office.

OUTCOME: The Chesterfield Wal Mart case from 2021 resulted in a guilty plea and a six month jail sentence. The Home Depot cases resulted in 1-year jail sentences. However a St. Charles County judge was a little tougher. A guilty plea on a Felony Theft in St. Peters resulted in a 3-year prison term.

40-YEAR-OLD MAN CAUGHT UNDER RINGING \$238 OF MERCHANDISE AT WAL MART

On Saturday August 20, 2022 two Chesterfield Police officers responded to the Wal Mart store reference a man under ringing a large amount of items at a Self-Check out registered.

On arrival the officers found that store security had already stopped the suspect, Tobias J. Lockhart, 40, of north St. Louis. Officers were informed that Lockhart was on video scanning some items but failing to scan and pay for 27 items of clothes and food totaling \$238.78.

Lockhart admitted to officers stealing the merchandise claiming he has financial problems.

Despite being a convicted **Child Sex Abuser (Sodomy involving a 7-year-old girl)** Lockhart had no stealing arrests or convictions at the time of the Wal Mart theft. He was not arrested and booked at the police station but released on a citation.

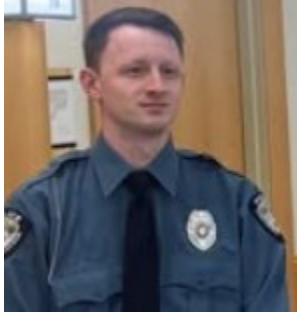

Once stopped, Officer Maedge walked to the passenger side of the car and while speaking with the driver, Sawyer Lownsdale, 21, of Chesterfield, he could easily smell a very strong odor of BOB (booze on Breath) and slurred speech.

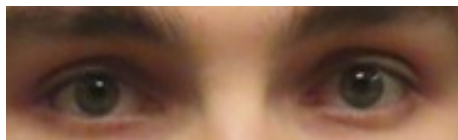

OUTCOME: Lownsdale was represented by an attorney who regularly has dinner with, his father, who got the Chesterfield Prosecutor Tim Englemeyer Magic. On May 3, 2023 Sawyer pled guilty to DWI and was given a 2-year SIS (no points, no fine, no permanent record) probation with Community Service required. The speeding charge was reduced to a Parking Violation with a \$191 fine. Despite speeding, driving drunk and refusing to take a breath test, Lownsdale and dad left the courtroom with no points on his record.

DRUNK DRIVER HAD MORE THAN A HEADLIGHT OUT. On Monday March 29, 2021 at 9:42 pm Town and Country Police Officer Alex Pflueger, driving west on I-64 from I-270 observed a vehicle approaching from behind with only one headlight. Officer Plueger let the car (a Hyundai) pass and then tried to stop it with the marked police car's overhead lights flashing.

The Hyundai driver put on his right turn blinker, but did not stop. Instead, he exited at Mason Road with two tires on the right shoulder. The driver continued without stopping and turned east onto North Forty Road and finally pulled into a parking lot of a medical building.

Officer Pflueger asked him where he was going and he said "home." When asked where "home" was he replied, "Bellefontaine Neighbors" which is in the opposite direction of West St. Louis County, located in far Northeast St. Louis County. The driver, Courtney Tyrone Chambers, was asked again where he was going and he replied again to Bellefontaine Neighbors. Finally, it was determined that he lived in Ballwin.

It was clear to Officer Plueger that Chambers was intoxicated. When asked if he had anything to drink, Chambers said two beers at a friend's house. He then changed that to "two tall beers."

Chambers failed field sobriety tests. When asked if he had any weapons or drugs on him he replied, "a gun." He then mentioned he had some marijuana in the car. A pat down revealed no gun on Chambers.

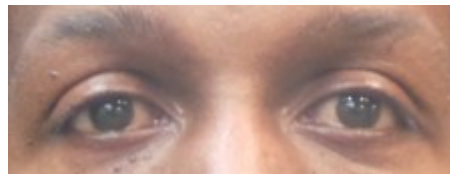
A check of the car revealed a Glock automatic pistol on the driver's floorboard and a bag of marijuana on the passenger's floorboard.

At the police station Chambers refused to take a breath test or be interviewed.

This was not Chambers first trip to the Town and Country Police Station. On February 8, 2021 he was arrested for DWI and Speeding. In that case he was placed on Probation for DWI and paid a \$466 fine for speeding.

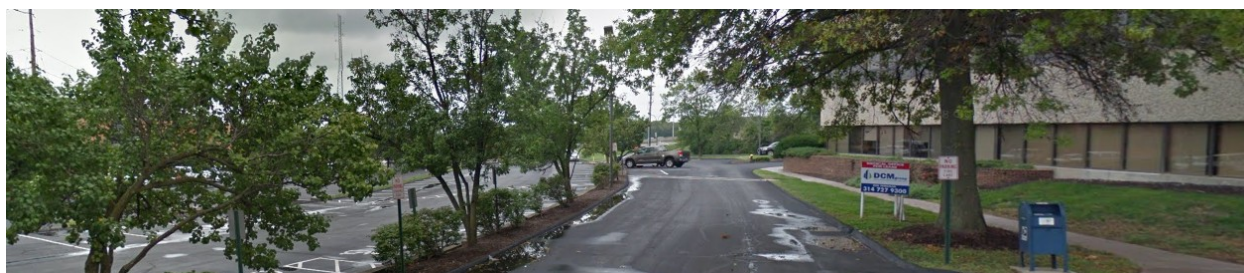

SUSPECT ARRESTED ATTEMPTING TO ENTER PARKED CARS AT THE 777 S. NEW BALLAS MEDICAL BUILDING

Several Town and Country Police Officers responded on Thursday March 10, 2022 11:20am to a call of a man trying door handles to parked cars on the lot of the Mercy medical building at 777 S. New Ballas Road.

Officers found the person matching the description of the car tampering suspect in the building on the second floor.



The suspect, Tyson Freeman Chambers, 42, of an apartment in the east end of Maplewood, admitted he was on the parking lot trying car door handles. He was also seen by a witness enter the building and started trying to open doors without success.

When asked how he got to Town and Country, Chambers said a police officer drove him. A computer check on Chambers revealed two hours earlier the Chesterfield Police entered a Field Interview Report into the commuter system on Chambers.

A call to Chesterfield PD revealed Chambers and another man were stopped on a parking lot in Chesterfield. The other man was arrested for Tampering. A Chesterfield officer drove Chambers to the Metro Transit bus stop in Town and Country close to the 777 Building.

At one point Chamber said his was trying to find “Dr. Green” in the building.

Chambers was arrested for Tampering with Autos and taken to the Town and Country Police Station.

At the police station he was given his rights and interviewed, at which time he stated he took a t-shirt and some CDs from cars he found unlocked. A few minutes later he denied taking anything.

Chamber said he took Xanax regularly and also sold some.

An officer applied for tampering charges with the County Prosecutor which were denied. Municipal charges were later issued.

OUTCOME: On April 7, 2023 Chambers pled guilty to Tampering and was placed on a 2-year SIS probation. The arrest and guilty plea will disappear from public records on April 7, 2025.

MEDICAL AIDE AT DELMAR GARDENS VILLA WEST ARRESTED FOR FELONY THEFT AND BURGLARY: A newly hired Medicine Aide at Delmar Gardens Villa West was found to be stealing maintenance tools and medical supplies.

On Saturday June 26, 2021 a Town and Country Police officer responded to the facility and met with manager Vicky Busso and maintenance supervisor Victor Robben reference recent thefts from storage areas between June 15 and June 26.

The following items were stolen:

June 15 or 16 - Last sighting of reciprocating saw in storage room (Assisted Living building). Robben locked the door on the way out.

June 21 - Door to AL storage room discovered ajar. Reciprocating saw discovered stolen by Robben

June 22 - 2 "cookie" tins full of various HVAC copper fittings discovered stolen from maintenance room (Independent Living building).

June 23 - 2 partial rolls of copper tubing discovered stolen from maintenance room (IL building).

June 24 - newly purchased package of replacement HVAC copper fittings discovered stolen from maintenance room (IL building). Door lock re-keyed by maintenance.

June 25 - Robben stated he was off work, so unknown if anything was stolen

June 26 - Robben discovered 4 tanks of refrigerant fluid and a wire stripper tool stolen from maintenance room (IL building). Police called.

Total known loss to the facility is \$2926.94.

Busso considered employee **Marsha Sue Clark**, 38, who had just been hired in May of 2021, a possible suspect. Clark's schedule mirrored when the thefts occurred. Other employees stated that at times Clark would be missing from her work areas on the overnight shift.

On July 5th it was reported to the T&C Police that upon review of security video of a vehicle belonging to Clark was scene pulled up to a storage area where items were stolen.

The Icing on the Cake came on July 11 when Officer Wolff checked a Clark's facebook account and saw she was advertising some of the stolen items for sale.

On July 12 before midnight three T&C officers went to Gardens Villa West and arrested Clark for Felony Stealing.

Later on July 13, Detective Katie Exline attempted to interview Clark, who said she wanted a lawyer. She was being placed back in a holding cell when she then stated she would agree to an interview but would provide nothing in writing.

Clark was told detectives would contact her boyfriend ref the thefts and she stated that he had nothing to do with them...it was all her.

This is from Det. Exline's report:

Clark said she is poor and needed money. Clark said she would use a step ladder in the laundry area to climb over the wall into the maintenance room. Clark said she took the tanks of coolant and exited the maintenance room through the door and the door would lock behind her. She put the stolen items in her vehicle (black Nissan) that she parked around back.

Clark could not articulate a date of when this occurred, other than it was in the middle of the night.

Clark said one time she forced the door open (breaking the lock) to enter the room (see Burglary Rpt #21-661).

Clark called her boyfriend at their house trailer in Imperial, MO and asked him to bring what items she had not sold to the police station. He responded with both refrigeration tanks and a box of other items.

On Tuesday June 27 the director of Garden Villas West contacted the detectives reporting a company credit card had been stolen with \$1,416 of purchases between July 4 and July 20. Detectives found Clark on video at several locations the card was use.
