

DRUNKS AND THIEVES 2025 PART 3

MARCH 18, 2025

AN EMPLOYEE OF A TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT AGENCY ARRESTED FOR STEALING AT THE SHERIDAN SENIOR LIFESTYLE FACILITY WHILE WORKING AT A PARTY. On 11/14/17 the Sheridan elderly health care facility on Justus Post Road was having a “gala” event for residents. The Sheridan hired some temporary waiters and servers. One of those people was Leandro Maeder, 30, from Glendale.

During the evening Maeder was seen carrying a case of beer out of the building to his car. He was confronted by management staff who recovered the beer and told Maeder to leave.

The next day an Apple I-pad was also discovered missing.

Security Video from 11/14/17 showed Maeder out of the building with the I-pad in his hand. Later when he was stealing the beer he stopped and picked up the I-pad where he hid it.

On 11/17/17 Chesterfield Det. Matt Palozola called Maeder, who immediately asked if the call was about the I-pad. He then agreed to return it and made an appointment to come to the police station on 11/20/17.

In an interview Maeder said he was told he could take any leftovers in the kitchen. He then stated he took some beef and a “couple of beers.” When asked if the “couple of beers” was actually a case of beer, he replied “same thing.”

He said he found the I-pad while checking the main dining room at the end of the event and planned to try and find the owner (something he never did).

Maeder was arrested and booked for stealing and a summons was later issued. Then the long trail of Warrants being issued against Maeder for not appearing court and continued arrests on the warrants of Maeder by other police agencies.

OUTCOME: Maede finally appeared in Chesterfield Muni Court on the stealing charge from 2017 on March 26, 2024 Maeder finally arrived in Chesterfield Municipal Court and pled guilty

to stealing. He was sentenced to 2-days jail. If you look at all the time police officers spent picking up and booking Maede is was likely to be far more than 48 - hours

PAIR OF SHOPLIFTERS CAUGHT WITH A LOT OF LOOT On Sunday August 4, 2019 four Chesterfield Police Special Enforcement Officers responded to Tommy Hilfiger Store in the Premium Outlet Mall on a report of two women actively hiding merchandise in bags to steal.

On arrival a Mall Security Officer pointed out one of the women on the parking lot near a car. Officers Bromwich and Fenton contacted her, Tiffany Madison, 33, of St. Louis. In her Chevrolet SUN was a large Victoria's Secret bag that the Hilfiger employees reported was used in the theft.

Officers also observed clothes on the backseat and floor with price tags still attached. Also in the car was a large knife and a pair of brass knuckles.

At this point the other suspect, Irene Stewart, 43, exited the store and walked to the car. She was carrying a large purse. When she saw what was happening she walked away and entered a perfume shop in the mall.

Officers contacted her in the store and asked her outside. Her large purse had a divider in the middle. She opened the purse showing only half of the inside and told officers she had not been stealing anything. Officer Bromwich opened the rest of the purse and observed a pair of shoes from Tommy Hilfiger with the price tag still on them.

Steward started to walk away but was stopped and handcuffed. She then told officers, "Are you fucking serious? Over a pair of shoes ."

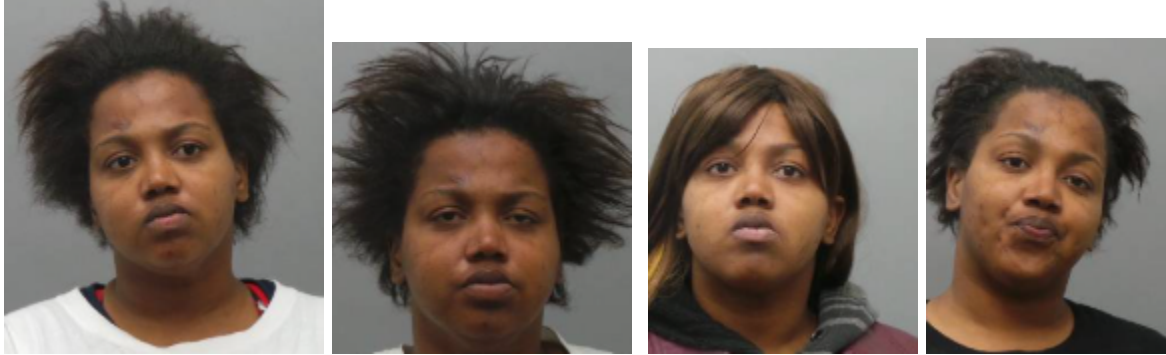

OUTCOME: On 08/23/18 Stewart pled guilty to Stealing and Resisting Arrest. She was fined \$500. Stewart died at age 47 on 08/19/23. Charges against Madison were dropped as she was serving a 10-year prison term for a Robbery in Joplin.

DRUNK DRIVER FROM SPAIN, STOPS FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS SAYING HE ALREADY KNOWS WHAT IS GOING TO HAPPEN. On Saturday night November 2, 2019 at about 10:25pm, Chesterfield Officer Wood had stopped a Ford SUV speeding 70 in a 55 on Woods Mill Road.

The driver of the Ford, Ignacio Margarida, appeared to have been drinking and Officer Wood was assisted by Officer Todd Lantz who is an expert on DWI arrests having received a number of awards from MADD.

Officer Lantz spoke with Margarida, who was born in Spain and now lives in St. Charles, admitted drinking some beer in Wildwood. This is from Officer Lantz’s report on his observations.

Margarida agreed to some field sobriety tests and stopped saying, “Listen Sir, I’m going to be honest with you guys. I don’t want to continue this test. I know where we are going.” He also refused to take a field breath test.

He was arrested and taken to the Chesterfield Police Station where he now agreed to take a breath test. At 11:15pm Margarida took the breath test that showed he was intoxicated with a BAC level of .105%.

He agreed to be interviewed and stated he did not consider himself intoxicated, that he only had two beers at a restaurant in Wildwood.

OUTCOME: On July 8, 2021 Ignacio Margarida WAS IN Chesterfield Municipal Court with an area defense attorney. Defense Attorneys come first and public safety second in the world of City Prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer, who reduced to the DWI to Careless and Reckless Driving with a \$191 fine. The Speeding charge was reduced to a Parking Violation with another \$191 fine.

CHESTERFIELD DETECTIVE EVENTUALLY CATCH UP TO SUSPECT STEALING CARTONS OF CIGARETTES FROM MOBILE ON THE RUN GAS

STATION/CONVENIENCE STORES. THE SUSPECT HAS THE LONGEST ARREST RECORD WE HAVE SEEN On Friday March 20, 2020 at 9:46pm Chesterfield Police were dispatched to the Mobil On The Run Gas Station/Store reference a \$243 theft of 4 cartons of Newport cigarettes.

The clerk told the responding officer the suspect asked for four cartons of Newport cigarettes. When the clerk placed the carton on the counter the suspect asked for another item. When the clerk turned their back, the suspect grabbed the cigarettes and fled in a grey Chevrolet compact car.

The suspect successfully fled the area and the case was turned over to the Detective Bureau.

On Monday 03/23/20 Det. Randy McWilliams received a copy of a security video from the store showing a Black/Male in his 20s with dreadlocks stealing the cigarette and getting into the car that had no license plates.

Chesterfield Officer Devin Holroyd told Det. McWilliams he had taken a similar theft report apparently involving the same suspect at another Mobil on The Run in Chesterfield. There was a bulletin issued to various police departments about similar theft with a suspect identified as Eric D. Marion with a mugshot photo. The clerk picked Marion out of a photo lineup as the thief.

Evidentially telephone contact was made with Marion who denied the thefts and said it might be his younger brother looks like him. He refused to give up his brother's name. It was quickly determined that it was Eric Marion, who had a long criminal arrest record.

CHESTERFIELD THEFTS OUTCOMES: For the misdemeanor stealing in 2020, he pled guilty on 6/12/22 and sentenced to 10-days jail. The Felony Theft on 04/05/24 he pled guilty on 10/25/24 and sentenced to 4-years in prison for this crime and several other felonies. On May 27, 2022 he was sentenced to 5-years in prison, but got an early release in January of 2024 and immediately started stealing again. He was then sentenced to 4-years back in prison.

DRUNK COLORADO MAN FLOURISHING GUN OUT CAR WINDOW IS ARRESTED FOR DWI. On Wednesday 09/27/23 at about 4pm the Ladue Police received a report of a driver going west on Clayton Road flourishing a handgun and passing cars. The description of the subject and the black Dodge he was driving was broadcast to Frontenac and Town and Country Police.

Town and Country Det. Sgt. Fred Yaakub was on Clayton Road and spotted the car. He followed the car to Ballas Road where the car was in the left turn lanes, but the driver drove beyond the stop line.

Sgt. Yaakub was joined by Sgt. Chris Moore in a marked patrol car. The driver turned left going south on Ballas Road and sped up going 50 in a 40 zone. When stopped, the driver, **Ryan C. Cline**, 46, of Elizabeth, Colorado, was ordered to put his hands out the window. It was then determined there was a Glock style handgun, now jammed between a front seat and the console. When asked if he had a handgun. Cline responded, I'm sorry." The gun turned out to be a Glock looking BB gun. Cline denied pointing the gun out the window and claimed no saw him do it or called the police.

It was clear to the officers that Cline had been drinking. He then stated that he was a diabetic, but he was fine. Paramedics responded to check Cline's blood sugar.

Cline was crying before the paramedics arrived. When Sgt. Yaakub asked Cline to do some field sobriety tests, replied, "I'm not going to do anything. I'm not doing shit for you." When the ambulance arrived Cline gave the officers the finger while getting into the ambulance.

Inventory of his Dodge revealed one empty bottle of Jack Daniel's Sour Apple and five unopened bottles and 3-six pack of Stella.

Sgt. Yaakub went to the Hospital and was explaining the Missouri Implied Consent Law to Cline, when Cline shouted out, "I'm not going to answer any of your fucking questions." He was issued citations for DWI and Speeding. (No mugshot available)\

Since his Town and Country charges, Cline was charged on 11/18/23 in St. Peters, MO to Leaving the Scene of an Accident (crash) and pled guilty on 06/25/24 in State Court and was placed on probation for two years.

OUTCOME: On the Town and Country cases Cline appeared in City Court on 02/24/24 with a defense attorney. He pled guilty to DWI and was placed on s 2-year SIS (no permanent record, no points, no fine) probation. The speeding citation was reduced to

a Parking Violation with a \$191 fine. Cline, who had moved to St. Peters, left court with no points on his driving record. His probation was not revoked due to the St. Peters arrest and guilty plea.

IN ROAD RAGE INCIDENT MISSOURI BAPTIST HOSPITAL SECURITY GUARD FIRED TWO BULLETS INTO A VEHICLE ON I-64. It was Friday November 4, 2022 at about 5pm, Christopher Collier, 43, a security guard at Missouri Baptist Hospital was driving in his Ford Escape to work east on I-64 east of Mason Road when he falsely claimed a Black Male driving a Dodge pickup truck tried to run him off the road. Collier is White.

The driver of the Dodge pickup said he was east on I-64 in stop and go rush hours traffic when Collier in the Ford tried to cut in front of him but there was no room. He said Collier started yelling, gave him the finger and then lowered the passenger window and pointed a black handgun at him causing him to slam on his brakes. Collier then shot at his truck twice.

The victim said he then pulled out of the exit lane and followed Collier hoping to get a license plate number. He said Collier drove past MoBap Hospital and pulled into a parking lot of a medical building at Ballas Rd and Clayton Rd.

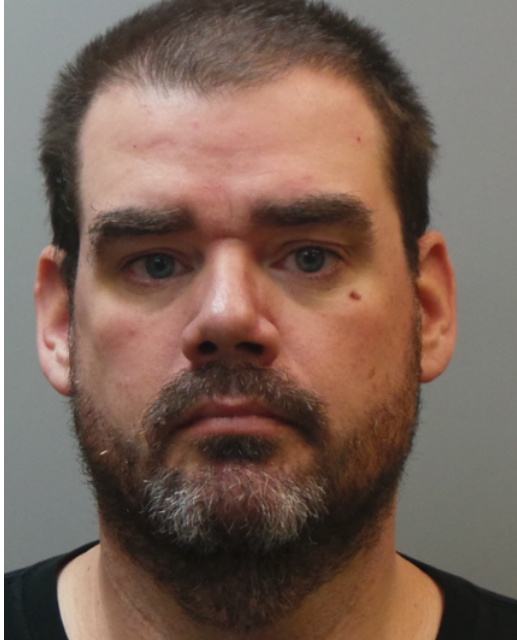
The victim said when Collier saw him, Collier backed into pole before taking off now going north on Ballas, again past MoBap Hospital. The victim had reached 9-1-1 and a description of Collier's Ford was dispatched.

Collier made it past Conway Road on Ballas into Creve Coeur where a Creve Coeur officer stopped him with a Town and Country officer arriving shortly.

On the passenger seat of Collier's Ford was a black Springfield Armoy .45 caliber pistol. Collier stated that he didn't shoot at anybody. He did say he lowered his right passenger window and pointed the gun at the victim's truck when the gun went off, scaring "the shit out of him." (Security Guards at Mo Baptist Hospital do not carry guns.)

The victim's statement and evidence of bullet holes in the truck showed that Collier lied. He shot twice at the victim.

Officers recovered the gun and photographed the two bullet holes in the truck, both reaching the engine. One was in the left front fender and the other was into the grill.

The County Prosecutor's Office filed Unlawful Use of a Weapon and Armed Criminal Action charges against Collier.

OUTCOME: On 09/12/14 Collier pled guilty to Unlawful Use of a Weapon and was sentenced to 4-years prison. The prison sentence was immediately set aside by a 5-year SES probation term. So a guy shoots at a car, maybe aiming at the driver on a busy interstate highway at rush hour and gets no prison.

DRUNK AND REVOKED DRIVER DROVE OFF ROAD INTO A DITCH AND LATER RAN FROM THE OFFICER. A week before Christmas, Friday night into Saturday morning December 18, 2021 at 12:03am. Cpl. Steve Doll had just checked a medical building on North Forty Drive and was exiting the parking lot drive when he saw that a vehicle had driven off the road, down an embankment and stuck in a muddy ditch between North Forty and I-64. It was raining at the time and had been raining for sometime.

The driver of the Kia Soul, Kyle Cook, 31, was still behind the wheel trying to back out of the ditch. When Cpl. Doll (Now Sgt Doll) made his way down to the car and had Cook step outside of the car it was clear that Cook was drunk. This from the report:

When Cook got out of the car he fell.

Cook stated he was heading home, which was right around the corner (Cook lived in St. Peters, MO). He further stated that his "buddies" were helping him to get out of the ditch. There were no "buddies" or anyone else at the scene. An empty cardboard Budweiser Beer case was under a front tire, apparently in a hope for traction.

Cook was asked where he was coming from and he stated "a bar just down the street." Just down the street was a City Park, a high school, a college and a church but no Bar. Further down the street was another church, park and the Mercy Hospital.

When asked for his drivers' license Cook went back to his car as Cpl. Doll followed. Doll observed an open Budweiser can on the center console and the back seat area littering with empty beer cans. He also saw that there was no place for Cook's "buddies" inside the car.

Cook then handed Cpl. Doll his passport instead of his drivers' license.

Cpl. Doll returned to his patrol car to run check on Cook and this happened (from the police report):

While in my patrol vehicle, I observed Cook return to the front seat of his vehicle and then get out and start walking west, away from the vehicle. Utilizing the patrol vehicle microphone, I instructed Cook to return to his vehicle. Cook looked back at me and then took off running up the hill located in front of the Lutheran Hour Ministries building. I notified dispatch of Cook running from the scene and initiated a foot pursuit of Cook.

Cook ran to the top of the hill and tried hiding by lying down in some tall grass. Once found he was arrested, handcuffed and taken to the police station.

At the police station Cook complained that he broken his thumb. He was taken to Mercy Hospital when a doctor determined the thumb was not broken, just sprained.

He was taken back to the police station and booked for DWI, Driving While Revoked, Fail to Drive in a Single Lane and Resisting Arrest. He refused to take a breath test but in an interviewed denied drinking.

OUTCOME: On June 1, 2024 Cook along with his Clayton defense attorney appear in Town & Country Court. Cook Pled guilty to DWI and was placed on a SES probation in lieu of 89-days in jail and a \$466 fine. Driving While Revoked was reduced to a Parking Violation with a \$191 fine and Fail to Drive in a Lane was reduced to a parking violation.

AN EARLY MORNING DRUNK DRIVER WHOSE CHEVY HAD THREE FLAT TIRES WAS PASSED OUT IN A LANE OF TRAFFIC: It was 6:57am on Saturday May 22, 2021 when Chesterfield Police Officer Amanda Rocklage observed a Chevy Impala stopped in the right WB lane of North Outer 40 Road with three flat tires.

Officer Rocklage went to the passenger side of the and knocked on the window telling the startled driver to roll down the window. He couldn't figure that out so Officer Rocklage opened the door asking the driver, **Trevon Marsaw**. 25, of Florissant, what happened to flatten three tires. Marsaw said he didn't know. Marsaw had a heavy amount of BOB (booze on breath).

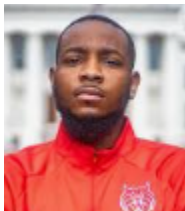
Marsaw was then instructed to pull to the shoulder out of the road. He didn't do this. Instead with 3-flats he turned into the parking lot of the Mercy Hospital Rehab Center. He still didn't stop but began driving around the building.



By now Officer Rocklage had an assisting officer, with her behind the suspect, and Officer Ghassemi pulling in front of him Marsaw finally stopped.

He failed field sobriety tests and agreed to take a field breath test that showed his BAC level at .235%. He also had pissed in his pants. He was arrested for DWI. At the police station he agreed to take an official breath test after booking. It showed his alcohol level dropping but still at a high level of .17%.

He agreed to be interviewed. He stated he did not know what the date was. He also said he did not consider himself drunk. He stated that in a two-hour period between 10 and midnight he had 5 tequila drinks at a nightclub in the Grove in St. Louis.

Four months later he was arrested for DWI in St. Charles County by the Highway Patrol. His BAC level was .19%. His Chesterfield probation was not revoked...ah in Chesterfield Drunk Drivers under prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer are no big deal as long as the pay a brother lawyer.

GAS STATION/CAR WASH CLERK STEALING LOTTERY TICKETS: On April 2, 2022 just before 3pm Chesterfield Officer Matt Niemeier was dispatched to the Country Club Wash (nowhere near a country club) on Chesterfield Airport Road reference a theft.

On arrival he met the manager who stated that there had been an employee theft of \$60 worth of lottery tickets. The manager had register receipts and security video that showed clerk **Airrion Jameil McClendon**, 27, twice during a shift on March 24 use his debit card to buy lottery ticket and then use the card to cancel the transaction after he had \$60 worth of Lottery Tickets in his possession.

McClendon arrived for work while Officer Niemeier was still there. The manager took him to the office, showed him the video of him stealing the lottery tickets at what time McClendon offered to pay for them. The manager refused and fired McClendon while Officer Niemeier issued him a citation for stealing.
