DRUNK DRIVER REFUSED BREATH TEST. WHEN ARRESTED HE WAS A RESIDENT OF ST. PETERS. WHEN HE PLED GUILTY HE WAS TRYING TO GET ON THE BALLOT TO RUN FOR MAYOR IN THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS.

On Sunday December 20, 2020 at 9:27 at night Chesterfield Police Officer Celia Saavedra was dispatched to the BP Gas Station at 909 Chesterfield Parkway East (Olive Blvd and Chesterfield Parkway) for a drunk driver earlier reported on WB I-64 driving erratically.



On arrival Officer Saavedra found the black Volkswagen described in the radio lookout on the parking lot with the engine running the car in 'Park.' Lassaad Mohamed Jeliti, 55, of St Peters, MO was behind the wheel.

Officer Saavedra contacted Jeliti and told him they (the police) had received complaints about his driving. She asked him if he had been using his phone and he stated that he had. While talking with Jeliti Officer Saavedra noticed signs that he had been drinking. He admitted having two beers while having dinner with his wife. The two beers later changed to a "glass of wine" and dinner with his wife changed to being at a party.

While speaking with Jeliti Officer Saavedra stated she told him to put down his cell phone. He did so, but then put the car in drive as if he was going to leave. She then ordered him to put the car in park, turn off the engine and step outside of the car. He complied.



Once out of the car Officer Saavedra attempted to do field sobriety tests, but Jeliti's balance was so bad he would not or could not stand still.

Jeliti was arrested for DWI taken to the Chesterfield Police station where he was booked and where he refused to take an official Breath Test. He was later released on a summons to a sober person.

Officer Saavedra contacted the witness who had followed Jeliti. The witness stated the Jeliti's speed kept changing as he swerve over three lanes on I-64 almost colliding with several cars.

OUTCOME: On February 8, 2021, less than two months after his arrest Jeliti pled guilty to DWI. Of course he had hired a local defense attorney. He was placed on a “No-Fine, No-Points, No Permanent Public Record” SIS probation. He did have to attend a Substance Abuse class and a Victims Impact panel.

At the time of his arrest Jeliti claimed to be a resident of St. Peters. However he filed and was on the ballot in the 2021 St. Louis City Mayor’s race for a very short time. His petition was 390 voters short of the required 1,170 signatures needed to run.

FEMALE DRUNK DRIVER FROM O’FALLON, MISSOURI PUT ON SUCH A SHOW WHILE BEING ARRESTED IT RESULTED IN A SIX-PAGE SINGLE SPACE REPORT

NARRATIVE: Officer Brendan Sieber of the Chesterfield PD made a lot of DWI arrests in the short time he was with the Chesterfield PD, before resigning to go to the Des Peres Department of Public Safety.

His reports were always thorough and detailed, but this DWI arrest resulted in one of his longer reports.

On Friday night into Saturday morning on November 16, 2019 at about 1:57AM Officer Sieber observed silver Volvo sedan being driven down the off-ramp from WB I-64 to Olive Blvd. in middle of the lane divider markings at a very slow rate of speed.

The driver, Britney Lea Janssen, 28, of O’Fallon, MO turned right and went east on Olive rapidly switching from lane to lane. Officer Sieber then pulled her over with her pulling into the BP gas station. (see prior story)

It was going to be a long night. From the police report here is how Officer Sieber described Ms. Janssen;

When Officer Sieber asked Janssen how much she had to drink, it started at one drink, went to two drinks and then down to 1 ½ drinks. At first she stated that she did not know what she was drinking and then later change that and said it tasted like Crown Royal.

Janssen refused to do any field sobriety tests. She was then asked if she wanted to take a Field PBT breath test. She would not answer directly. This is from the police report:

I... Okay, Officer... Here... Here's the thing. I don't know what my like rights are all the way.". I re-informed Janssen that based on my observations thus far, I had probable cause to arrest her and her choices were either to submit to a PBT, or not. I advised Janssen she did not have to perform any tests she did not want to perform. I again asked Janssen if she was willing to submit to a PBT. In response, Janssen looked away from me, toward the passenger side of her vehicle and sighed loudly.

Officer Sieber told her to exit her car. Instead she reached for her cell phone. Next is from the police report.

Janssen turned back toward me, threw her hands up in the air and said "I just broke my nail". I instructed Janssen for a fourth (4th) time to exit her vehicle. This time, Janssen sighed loudly before opening her door and stepping outside of her vehicle.

After Janssen refused to say if she would take a PBT breath test, she then sated "I hate to play the black card, but I am a black woman."

Officer Sieber placed her under arrest and got one hand in his handcuffs when more problems arose. Again from the police report:

I instructed Janssen to turn around and put her hands behind her back. Janssen pulled her left hand away from me before saying "No! I will take the breath test! Are you kidding me?". I was able to maintain control of Janssen via my grip on her right hand. Janssen said "Are you serious? I don't think [arresting her] that's necessary at all, Officer..." I successfully placed one handcuff on Janssen's left wrist, but as I went to place the other handcuff on Janssen's right wrist, she said "No..." before pulling away from me. When Janssen did this, I maintained control of her hands via a wrist-lock control grip. I firmly told Janssen not to pull away from me. Janssen began crying in a high-pitch tone as I successfully placed the remaining handcuff on her right wrist. I double-locked Janssen's handcuffs and checked them for proper fit in accordance with department standard operating procedures. Janssen continued crying

She then quit walking and had to be dragged to the police car at what time she screamed: (from the police report)


"NO! I'M NOT GETTING IN THE BACK OF THAT POLICE CAR! I'M SORRY!"

Apparently she was expecting an Uber to be called.

Once in the rear seat cage of the police car she continued screaming and kicking.

She did give permission to avoid a tow bill for officers to secure her car on the gas station parking lot. Checking the car for valuable officers found some valuable marijuana, seized it and later charged Janssen with Possession of Marijuana.

At the police station Janssen was crying, shaking and breathing heavily. She said she did not need any medical attention. She agreed to take an official breath test. The results of the test showed she was intoxicated as she tested at 0.095% BAC.



It was a little odd that Janssen would not take the field Breath Test that could not be used against her but took the official BAC test.

Outcome: Janssen has no record of prior violations or arrests. On 02/21/21 Janssen pled guilty to DWI and was placed on a 2-year SIS No-points, No-Fine, No-Permanent Public Record probation term. The Improper Lane Use citation was reduced to a \$191 Parking Violation. On the Possession of Marijuana charge she was placed on a 1-year SIS Probation. On the drug paraphernalia charge she pled guilty to a Health Code Violation and was fined \$268. It was another drunk driver (an uncooperative one) leaving the Chesterfield Court room with No Points on her driver's license thanks to the two most dangerous men in Chesterfield, recently retired Judge Rick Brunk and Prosecutor Tim Engelmeyer.

DRIVING WITHOUT YOUR HEADLIGHTS ON AT 1:30 IN THE MORNING MIGHT JUST GET THE ATTENTION OF THE POLICE. On Thursday night into Friday morning November 6, 2020 at 1:29AM Chesterfield Police Officer Devin Holroyd was on EB Olive Blvd near White Road when a black Audi passed him at a high rate of speed without any headlights on.

Officer Holroyd turned on his flashing lights and stopped the Audi before getting a radar reading.

Upon contacting the driver, Stuart Imber, 51 of Chesterfield, Officer Holyoyd, despite wearing a face mask due to the pandemic, immediately smelled the odor of booze on Imber's breath. Imber stated that he had two Manhattans while in Columbia, Mo. He was driving home from Columbia. It was not established if he had been driving for the last two hours without the Audi's headlights turned on.

Imber refused to take a field breath test but agreed to take field sobriety tests, which he failed.

He was arrested and transported to the Chesterfield Police Station. There he agreed to take a breath test. The results of the test showed his BAC level to be a 0.090%, just over the legal limit.

Imber was release on citations for DWI and OMV with No Headlights at Night to a sober person (his wife).

OUTCOME: The magicians in the Chesterfield Municipal Court (Judge Rick “Let’m Loose if they Hire a Lawyer” Brunk and Prosecutor Tim “Hire a lawyer and get a Deal” Engelmeyer turned the DWI into Careless and Reckless Driving. On 04/07/21 Imber pled guilty and was fined \$500. The OMV at Night W/O Headlights was reduced to a Parking Violation with a \$255 fine (a change in Missouri Law had capped parking fines at \$220 so this must have included court costs.)

AT 11:20 IN THE MORNING REPEAT DRUNK DRIVER PASSED OUT IN THE INTERSECTION OF KEHRS MILL ROAD AND CLARKSON ROAD. Cops deal with drunk drivers at 11:20 all the time, but it is almost always 11:20 at night, 40 minutes before midnight, not 40 minutes before noon.

On Friday May 3, 2019 at 11:23 AM Chesterfield Police were dispatched to a driver passed out behind the wheel in the intersection of Kehrs Mill Road and Clarkson Road, a major intersection with an electric signal.

Officer Jenna Christian responded to the call and on arrival found the intersection was clear. However the person who called the police about the BMW being stopped in the middle of the intersection called dispatch back and advised that the driver came to and drove the BMW onto the parking lot of the Schnucks supermarket at the southeast corner of the intersection. The store is actually in Ballwin. The caller further advised that she had followed the BMW down Kehrs Mill Road and the driver was swerving into the oncoming lane.

Officer Christian and another officer then drove to the Schucks parking lot where they found the car, with the engine running, a man asleep in the drivers’ seat, the car in neutral and his foot on the brake.

Officer Christian and Officer Kyle Tyndell attempted to wake the driver by knocking on the window with no luck. Officer Christian opened the driver’s door and shook the driver awake and then told him to put the car in Park. At first he did not responded and Officer

Christian in uniform loudly identified herself as a police officer and again told the driver to put the car in park.

This caused the driver to take his foot off the brake and the car rolled forward causing Officer Christian to reach across the driver and slam the car into park.

When doing this Officer Christian noticed a strong odor of booze coming from the driver. She identified him as Gavin Freeman, 41, of Kehrsdale Drive in Clarkson Valley.

From the police report, this is what happened when Freeman was told to get out of the car:

As he did so he placed his left leg on the ground outside the car and turned slightly to the left in an attempt to get his other leg out of the car. While pulling his second leg out of the car he stumbled and fell into me. PO Tyndell and I were able to catch him before he fell to the ground and help him stand up. As soon as we let go of Freeman he started to fall again, leaving PO Tyndall to physically hold him up. Due to the fact Freeman was unable to stand on his own with out falling and needed assistance just to walk, I chose not to conduct field sobriety testing for Freeman's safety.

Freeman was arrested and placed in the back of Officer Tyndell police car. Apparently Freeman did not understand that he was headed to a police station and twice asked if they were going to take him home.

AT the police station Freeman refused to take a breath test. Officer Christian checked him for past DWIs and found two convictions. One was from 2017 from a DWI in Ballwin. The other was in 2013 in St. Matthew, Kentucky. This made the Chesterfield arrest a felony and required Officer Christian to go to the County Prosecutor's Office and get a search warrant to draw blood since Freeman refused to take a breath test.

Prior to the search warrant application and immediately after his arrest Freeman agreed to be interview. Here are some highlights from the interview.

When asked what time it was Freeman said "4:30." It was actually 12:05pm

When asked what the date was, Freeman said it was "Late March." It was May 3. 2019.

When asked if he had been drinking and what he had been drinking, Freeman said he had been drinking Vodka and he does not know when he started or where he had been drinking, saying "I have no idea." He did admit that he considered himself intoxicated.

Officer Christian obtained the search warrant to draw blood and at 3:35pm or 4 hours after Freeman had been in custody he was taken to St. Luke's Hospital for the blood draw. He repeatedly said he was not giving permission for anyone to draw blood.

An emergency room nurse followed the Orders of Judge Kerr in the warrant and drew two vials of blood from Freeman that she released to Officer Christian.

Lab results: Blood that was drawn four hours after Freeman's arrest came back showing a BAC level of .289%.

OUTCOME: Freeman was approved to appear in an “Alternative Court.” On January 25, 2021 he pled guilty to Felony DWI and was placed in a special court program.

22-YEAR-OLD DRINKING GIN AT BAR FOR 4-HOURS LEAVES IN HIS DODGE CHARGER ONLY TO HAVE HIS TRIP HOME END IN TOWN AND COUNTRY. On Friday September 18, 2020 Town and Country Officer Steven Doll was responding to a call for a Motorist Assist on Topping Road near Pingry Place. According to the dispatch center the call was made by Jack Martin about his car having a flat tire.

Pingry Place and Topping Road is close to the Town and County southern border with Des Peres and Manchester Road. On his way to the call Officer Doll used Manchester Road and observed on WB Manchester before Topping Road a tire and rim on the side side of the road.

On his arrival Officer Doll found Martin behind the wheel of his black Dodge Charger, which was missing the right front tire and wheel and had fender damage. The Charger was blocking the northbound lane of Topping Road.

When Officer Doll arrived he noticed Martin open the driver’s door and attempt to exit the vehicle. Martin’s balance was very unsure and had to use the car to keep from falling several times.

Martin said he hit a curb. Officer Doll asked him where he hit the curb and Martin said he didn’t know.

From the police report, these are Officer Doll’s original observations of Martin:

Officer Doll asked how much Martin had to drink. He said he only had “two drinks.” A short time later that increased to four and in an interview at the police station it went to six gins at the Circa Pub in Des Peres.

Martin agreed to take field sobriety tests which he failed. He also agreed to take a Field PBT breath test. The results of that test showed Martin BAC level to be .174%.

Martin was arrested. The Charger was towed away.

At the police station Martin agreed to take a breath test. The test showed he was still very intoxicated but at least his BAC level was dropping. The result was .154%.

Count 1 - Defendant sentenced to Fine \$155.50 and Court Cost

TOWN AND COUNTRY OUTCOME: On January 8, 2021 Martin with a defense attorney pled guilty to drunk driving in front of Town and Country Judge Andrea Niehoff.

Did he ever get a deal. He was given a SIS No-Points, No-Fine, No Permanent record ONE-YEAR probation. These probations are normally two years long. Also there were no DWI awareness classes ordered.

WOMAN ON A MISSION WITH A 20-YEAR RECORD OF STEALING, SHOPS FOR BOOZE AT TARGET WITH NO INTENTION OF PAYING. Rosalind McAdoo, 44, of a number of addresses across Missouri including jails and prisons, shops but doesn't buy. She either steals or writes bad checks. On Sunday July 28, 2019 at 3:15 in the afternoon she was in Town and Country shopping for booze at Target with no intention of paying.

Store security watched as she put 750 ML bottle of Grey Goose Vodka (\$29.99) in her handbag and a bottle of Patron Tequila (\$37.99) under her blouse and then stopped shopping and started to leave the store before being stopped by store security beyond the cash registers.



McAdoo did not resist the store security man stopping her and having her join him in the security office to wait for the police.

Town and Country Officer Chris Hunt (now retired) arrived to arrest McAdoo. While still at the security office he ran a check on McAdoo and found she had numerous stealing arrests and convictions. More than four in 10-years mean an arrest for any kind of stealing offense is a felony.

OUTCOME: On 11/17/20 McAdoo pled guilty to a reduced charge of misdemeanor Stealing, she was sentenced to 6-months in jail but given credit for time served waiting in jail which greatly reduced her jail time to zero. She was released after being sentenced,

The Return of McAdoo. On 02/20/21 she returned to Town and Country and was arrested for Felony Stealing at Home Depot. After being in jail for two months her public defender got her released on a summons.

DRUNK DRIVER TWICE THE LEGAL LIMIT, WEAVING AND ALMOST HITTING A VEHICLE ON I-64 LEAVES TOWN AND COUNTRY COURT CONVICTED OF PARKING VIOLATIONS WITH NO POINTS. JUSTICE FOR NO ONE, ESPECIALLY THE PUBLIC. Town and Country Officer Dustin York was patrolling West of I-64 from I-270 on Friday night into Saturday morning at 1:09 AM on March 7, 2020 when he noticed a gray Jeep Grand Cherokee SUV in front of him weaving across lanes. He then saw the Jeep change lanes to the left and nearly hit a minivan, which the Jeep driver then followed only about one vehicle length behind the minivan.

Officer York then saw the driver weave over lane markings and then finally saw enough and stopped the Jeep on I-64 just west of Hwy 141.

York contacted the driver of the Jeep Andrew Curtis Moran, 24, of Creve Coeur. Officer York immediately noticed that Moran appeared to be drunk, but Moran was claiming he had just had one beer. These were Officer York's observation from the police report:

Moran failed the majority of the field sobriety tests. He agreed to take a field Breath Test that showed his BAC to be .155%. That would indicate much more than one-beer. It would later be determined that his BAC level was rising.

Moran was arrested and transported to the Town and Country Police station. He would later state that he was not sure if he was at the Ballwin Police station or the Town and Country station.

At the police station Moran agreed to take an official breath test. The results showed his BAC level was going up as he tested .16%.


He agreed to be interviewed. In the interviewed he first said he only had “one beer” but then changed that to “four.” Despite failing sobriety tests and breath tests that showed he was double the limit, Moran said he did not consider himself intoxicated. Here is the interview:

OUTCOME: Town and Country prosecuting attorney Keith Cheung and Judge Andrea Niehoff threw PUBLIC SAFETY out the window. Moran hired a lawyer from Webster Groves who advertises being a “DWI Defense Attorney.”

Cheung reduced both probable cause moving violation charges to non-traffic parking violations. Despite almost hitting a car, then following too closely On March 31, 2021 Moran pled guilty to two offense he did not commit, Illegal Parking. He was fined \$191.50 on one Parking charge and \$116.50 on the other.

On the DWI charge Moran pled guilty and was given a “No-Point, No-Fine, No-Permanent Public Record” SIS probation. Someone who mailed in their speeding ticket with a check has a worse driving record than Moran.

IN A WARM-UP TO THE HOLIDAY SHOPPING AND STEALING SEASON POLO SHOP SECURITY CATCHES WOMAN REMOVING SECURITY SENSORS AND STEALING CLOTHES. 15-Days before the 2019 Thanksgiving and the monthlong holiday shoplifting season Shyela Isaiah went to the Polo Outlet Store in Chesterfield Valley.

At about 5pm she shopped and found what she wanted. She then removed a magnet hidden under her blouse and used it to remove the security sensors on three clothing items valued at \$233.97.

She then exited the store by a side door but was stopped outside by a store security employee who brought her back into the store and called the Chesterfield Police to respond.

Officer Jason Bromwich responded, photographed the evidence and arrested Isaiah. She was taken to the Chesterfield Police station and later released on summonses for Possession of a Theft Device and Stealing.

Isaiah has no other criminal offenses on her record, but does have a number of civil actions filed against her.

OUTCOME: Once again Chesterfield City Prosecutor Tim “Let’s Make a Deal” Engelmeyer and Judge Rick “Let’m Loose” Brunk did nothing to identify Shyela Isaiah as a thief, since she hired a lawyer from Clayton. To hell with protecting retail stores that provide sales taxes to fund the city’s daily operation. If Isaiah was just walking out with some items maybe she should have gotten a break. But she planned to steal and brought a device to remove security sensors.

On 01/11/21 the Possession of a Theft Device was reduced to a Health Code Violation and she was fined \$250. The stealing charge was also reduced to a Health Code Violation with a \$200 fine. When it was over she was not convicted of any criminal violation.

STOLEN CLOTHES IN THE CAR AND MORE STOLEN CLOTHES DOWN HER PANTS WHEN ARRESTED Marla Neil, 24, came out to the Chesterfield Outlet stores to steal on two consecutive days in March of 2019. The Chesterfield Police were called on March 6 when an employee of Tommy Hilfiger’s stopped Neil leaving the store and took an item she was stealing from her (she missed another one).

The employee watched Neil and another woman enter a car on the parking lot and notified the police. Officers Matt Pousson and Jason Bromwich found the car and kept Neil from driving off.

Upon contacting Neil and her passenger the officers noticed a number of clothing items in the car still with price tags on them.

The women were arrested, but only Neil was charged.





OUTCOME: On 09/10/19 Neil, without a lawyer, pled guilty to stealing. Guess what? Without a lawyer Judge Brunk actually convicted her and fined her \$500. She also pled guilty to Possession of a Theft Device and was fined \$100. Warrants were issued on 01/15/20, not for failing to pay the fines, but for Failure to Appear in Court to explain why she has not paid the fines. To pay the fines she need to shoplift more.

Neil has been involved in four different thefts in Chesterfield, including two felonies. The municipal judge giving her cash fines she will never pay is stupid. She needs a couple months of jail time. Yes it will cost the city money, but at some point that is what your criminal justice system has to do; to provide safety to the retail community. On 09/10/19 after her guilty plea she was arrested again in Chesterfield for stealing. Why waste a trip to West County?
