

DRUNKS AND THIEVES 2024 PART 7

OCTOBER 15, 2024



AFTER SEVERAL CALLS OF A DRUNK DRIVER, POLICE FIND 21-YEAR-OLD DRIVER HAD JUST ARRIVED HOME. HER BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT WAS 3-TIMES THE LEGAL LIMIT. At about 7:20pm on Thursday September 1, 2022 concerned motorists began calling the Chesterfield Police about a female drunk driver.

The driver while on I-64 swerve and almost hit a car in another lane. The driver of the Nissan Rogue SUV then exited I-64 on the Olive/Clarkson exit at a high speed having to slammed on the brakes and verve off the road to avoid hitting 10 cars stopped for the red light at the end of the ramp.

A concerned motorist followed the Nissan down Clarkson Road while calling the police. The driver turned into a subdivision, stopped got out of the Nissan, walked around then got back in it and drove off. The witness described the driver as a young female between the ages of 18-21. The police found the vehicle parked in front of a house on Sycamore Dr.

Officers went to the door and an older woman answered the doorbell. When asked who was driving the Nissan she stated, her daughter, Jenna Karl. An officer contacted Jenna in the front yard where her balance was very unsure, she reeked of BOB (booze on breath), her speech was slurred and eyes bloodshot. This is from the police report:

Karl stated she had nothing to drink since she got home. A Field Breath Test showed her BAC level to be .248%.

She was arrested for DWI. At the police station she took the "official" breath test that showed her BAC level was slightly dropping. It was now at .235%.

She agreed to be interviewed. She gave the wrong date, then admitted having an entire bottle of champagne at 10am. She also stated that she considered herself intoxicated.

Since her arrest Karl moved to Denver. On December 12 she pled guilty and was placed on a 2-year SIS (no points, no fine, no permanent record) probation. She was cited for the moving violations on I-64 and Clarkson Road and saw the charge reduced to a parking violation with a \$191 fine. She left the courtroom with NO POINTS on her record.

WOMAN FROM ST. CHARLES COUNTY DRIVING A CAR WITH TEXAS LICENSE PLATES STOPPED FOR LANE WEAVING AND TURNED OUT TO BE DRUNK It was just after midnight on Saturday night/Sunday morning September 3 , 2023 (Labor Day weekend) and Town and Country Police Sgt. Dan Duddleston was east on I-64 from Mason Road when he saw a black Cadillac in front of him lane weaving and speeding 74 mph in a 60 zone.

The Cadillac did not exit onto I-270 or at Ballas Road. Sgt. Duddleston stopped the Cadillac, that had Texas License Plates, east of Ballas Road and contacted the driver, Tanesha Williams, 41, of O'Fallon, MO.

Williams showed several signs of drinking and being intoxicated. She said she had just had 2 glasses of wine. This is from the police report:

She took field sobriety tests and failed the balance and walking tests. A field breath test showed he BAC level to be .119%. She was arrested and the car was towed. She was

issued citations for DWI and Improper Lane Use (weaving) and given a pass on the speeding.

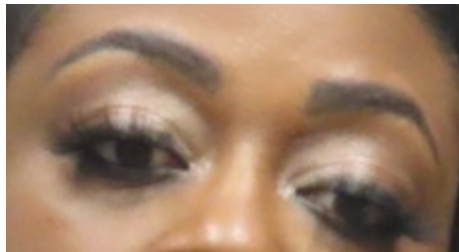
At the police station she agreed to take an official breath test. The results were the same as the field test, .119% BAC.

In an interviewed Williams admitted drinking claiming she had two glasses of wine at her house before being stopped.

She has no other traffic offenses in Missouri on her record.

OUTCOME: On 12/28/23 Williams appeared in Town and Country Court, pled guilty to DWI and was placed on a 2-year SIS (no points, no fine, no permanent record) probation. She also pled guilty to the Lane Weaving Charge and was fined \$191.

108 MPH GETS DRIVER LATE FOR A MOVIE ARRESTED On June 22, 2021 Town and Country Police Officer Ron Nicoletti was driving west on I-64 from east of I-270 in an unmarked patrol car when he noticed a car approaching from the rear at a very fast rate of speed.

Officer Nicoletti (now Sgt. Nicoletti) turned on his radar and clocked the car at 108 mph. He stopped the car as the driver was exiting onto NB I-270 and contacted the driver, Jordan J. Wilson 27, of Kirkwood. In the passenger seat was Wilson's girlfriend.

Wilson said he was unaware he was driving that fast. He has an extensive traffic record. He was arrested and the car was released to his girlfriend. He was issued citation for Speeding 108 and Unregistered Vehicle.

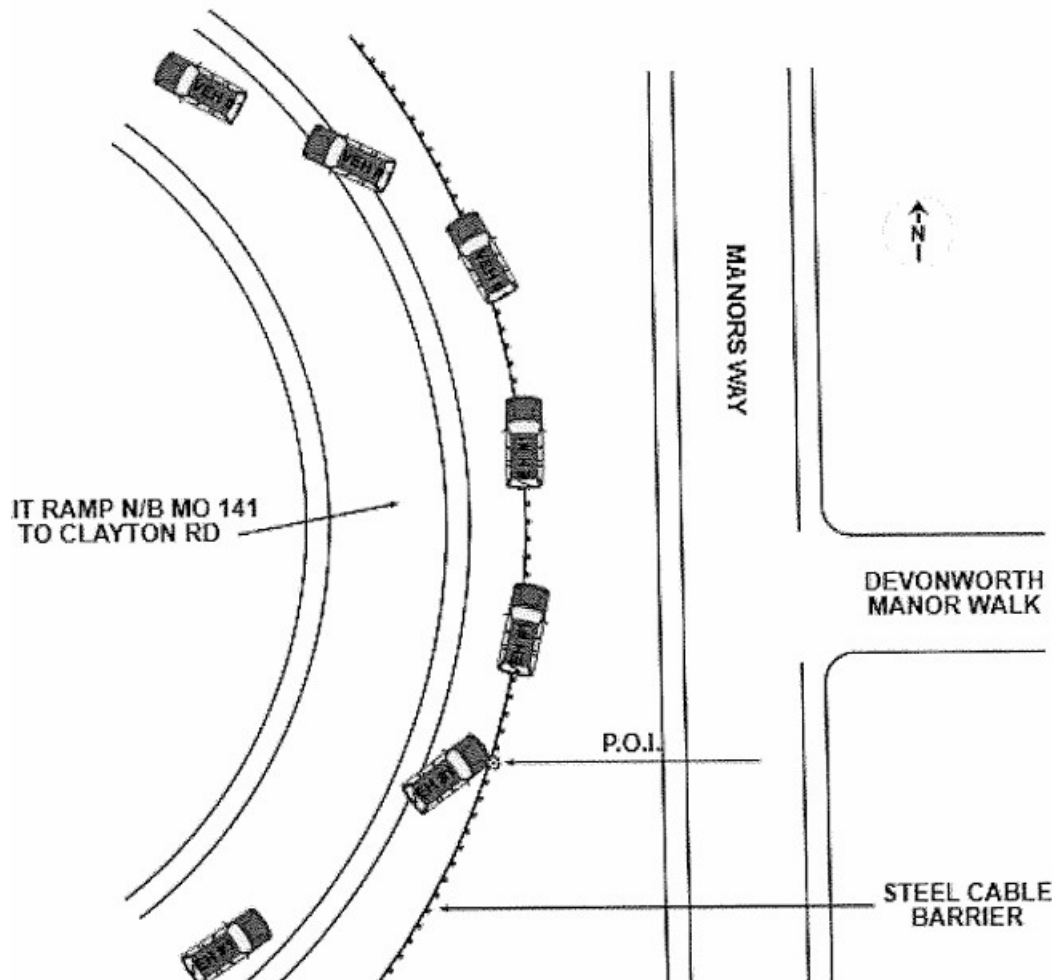
OUTCOME On June 16, 2022 Wilson appeared in Town & Country Court. He pled guilty to Speeding 108 and was fined \$466. He was fined \$36 for the Unregistered car.

47-YEAR OLD DRUNK WOMAN SEVERELY WRECKS HER VOLVO AFTER DRIVING OFF ROAD AND CRASHING INTO A GUARDRAIL. DESPITE A WITNESS FOLLOWING AND IDENTIFYING HER SHE DENIED DRIVING HER CAR AND REPEATEDLY SAID SHE WAS AT A BAR. At 7:02pm Monday May 29, 2023, Memorial Day, a motorist on northbound Hwy 141 witnessed a blue Volvo in front of her swerving.

She then witnessed the white/female behind the wheel drive off the road and strike a guardrail to the Clayton Road exit, drive against the guardrail hitting metal posts that kept the guardrail in place.

The drunk driver exited at Clayton Road and the witness pulled alongside her at a red light and told her she needed to pull over and stop as the Volvo's engine was leaking fluid on the road.

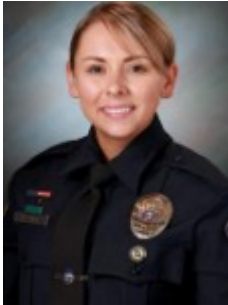


A later traffic crash investigation showed the Volvo struck 13 metal guardrail posts over 120 feet.

The witness said the drunk driver waved, said "okay" and drove off with the engine smoking and fluids still pouring on the road. The witness had part of this on her video

recorder. The witness then called the Town & Country Police and continued to follow the drunk driver who turned from WB Clayton Road onto NB Woods Mill Road and then into the Willow Bend Apartment complex, where part of the front end of the Volvo fell onto the parking lot entrance.

Town and Country Officer Prewitt arrived as the driver was staggering into the apartment building and apartment #2.

After looking at the damage to the car Officer Prewitt went to Apartment 2 and contacted the resident and driver, **Jamie Wynd**, who at first refused to step out of her apartment. She then agreed to go with Officer Prewitt and look at her Volvo. This is where things got interesting and repetitive.

Officer Prewitt asked Wynd how much she had to drink and the first answer was “Not much.” That would quickly change to she had nothing to drink.

Wynd was clearly highly intoxicated. Her balance was very unsure and she had problems walking.

Her car was not parked in a parking space but across spaces. She denied it was improperly parked and claimed it was in a space.

When walking to her car she denied driving it and parking it there. An officer assisting Officer Prewitt asked Wynd what kind of car she owns and she replied, "It doesn't really matter."

From the police report:

Jamie refused to perform any further field sobriety tests. I advised Jamie she was under arrest for driving while intoxicated at approximately 1937 hours. I explained to Jamie we will be going back to the police station to book her for D.W.I. and she stated, "No you won't. You absolutely will not."

She was arrested for DWI and Leaving the Scene of an Accident (crash). She was handcuffed and when placed back in the police car she jammed her right leg against the open door and began chatting denials. This is front the report:

Cpl. Sapienza walked over to assist me at this time, and he explained to her she was under arrest for driving under the influence.

Jamie stated, "You have no proof of that. There's no fucking proof of that."

I again commanded Jamie to place her foot inside the vehicle. Jamie did not comply, and stated, "No, there is no proof of it! You are... No! No! There is no proof of it. I didn't blow. There's no freakin proof of it."

Cpl. Sapienza commanded Jamie to place her foot inside the door, and she can call her lawyer from the station. Jamie stated, "No, I am not going to do that." I commanded Jamie again to place her foot inside the door, and she stated, "No, you can mace me if you want to."

Cpl. Sapienza attempted to guide Jamie's foot/leg back into the vehicle, and she stated, "Are you kidding me? You guys are being ridiculous." At this time, Jamie's foot/leg was back inside the vehicle, and the door was now shut.

All of a sudden Wynd, who earlier claimed she had nothing drink, now said she was not driving her Volvo (that was basically totaled) but she was in a bar. From the report:

Jamie continued to explain to me, "I was literally sitting in a bar. You cannot arrest me for driving under the influence when I was sitting in a bar. You cannot do that. I was literally, literally not even in my car. Was not even in my car. You are being completely illegal."

I explained to Jamie that I had just finished reading her the implied consent. Jamie stated, "No, you didn't. No, you did not." I explained to Jamie that I did indeed read her implied consent, and I had it on recording via my body worn camera.

Jamie stated, "Because I was in the parking lot? In the bar. Is that what you are accusing me of? I wasn't even in my car. I don't even want to talk to you anymore. I want you to let me out of here."

I explained to Jamie that I could not let her out until we made it through the booking process first. Jamie stated, "Oh... because I did what? Because I was sitting at the bar?"

Jamie stated, "I was at the bar. I wasn't driving. I wasn't doing anything wrong. I don't know who called you and told you to arrest me. I was not doing anything wrong, and you are messing with the wrong person because I will come right back at you."

Jamie stated, "I wasn't doing anything wrong. I was in the freakin bar. I can't wait to tell everyone at French Quarter about how you can just be sitting at the bar."

Jamie stated, "I was sitting at the bar. I could have gotten an uber home, if you wouldn't have fucked this up for me."

Normally we write these articles based on the reports, but in Officer Prewitt's case her 14-page arrest report was so good we used much of it to tell the story.

Wynd was interviewed and she denied drinking or driving. Despite being arrested at her apartment in Town and Country by a uniformed Town and Country Police Officer, placed in a Town and Country marked police car and then driven to the Town and Country City Hall and Police Station, she said in the interview that she thought she was in the City of Manchester or maybe Ballwin.

OUTCOME: Wynd hired well known DWI defense attorney Travis Noble. She appeared in Town and Country Municipal Court on 03/07/24. Despite being arrested and convicted of Leaving the Scene of an Accident (crash) in Ellisville, Wynd got a deal. She pled guilty to both charges and was placed on a 2-year SIS (no fine, no-points, no permanent record) probation term. Once again Town and Country Justice is looking out for defense attorney’s paycheck first and public safety second.

PASSING A POLICE CAR ON YOUR BIRTHDAY AT 90 MPH IS A GOOD WAY TO GET ARRESTED FOR DWI.

Town and Country Police Officer, Sgt. Freddie Yaakub was west on I-64 past Mason Road. It was Friday night April 7, 2023 at 9:21pm when a red Ford pickup truck passed Yaakub clocked at 90 mph in the 60 zone. Sgt. Yaakub followed the truck to the Hwy 141 exit where drivers on the exit lane changed lanes to get out of the way of the speeding truck.

The driver turned left on SB Hwy 141 and was stopped by Sgt. Yaakub Upon contacting the driver, Kyle Yeager 34, it was clear that he had been drinking as he had a strong amount of BOB (booze on breath), bloodshot eyes and slurred speech. Yeager said he was in a hurry to get home and let his dog out.

Yeager said he had dinner at the Oceana restaurant in Clayton. At booking he gave an address in Columbia, Illinois but he was going west on I-64 away from Illinois.

When asked how much he had to drink Yeager said, "Nothing!" Sgt. Yaakub then told him he could smell booze on his breath. Yeager, the only person in the car said, "It's not me." Sgt. Yaakub then suggested that he take a field breath test to prove he had not been drinking. Yeager said that Sgt. Yaakub could not give the test without his lawyer present. He did agree to take field sobriety tests. Yeager lost his balance exiting the truck. He then failed the sobriety tests. This is from the police report:

He was arrested and his truck was towed.

At the police station he did a 180 and agreed to take a breath test. The results showed he was drunk with a .143% BAC level.

In an interview he now admitted drinking having started at 5pm at his house. Yeager said he did not know how many drinks he had and did not consider himself intoxicated.

He was charged with DWI, Speeding and Following Too Close.

OUTCOME: We could not find any prior arrests or moving violations involving Yeager in Missouri or two counties in Illinois. On June 1, 2023 Yeager with a defense attorney Pled Guilty to DWI and was placed on a 2-year SIS (no points, no fine, no permanent record) probation. The Following Too Close charge was dropped and he Pled Guilty to Speeding 90 mph in a 60 zone and fined \$316.

ANOTHER BIRTHDAY PARTY PRODUCED ANOTHER DRUNK DRIVER On Friday night into Saturday morning Town and Country Officer Josh Hamel was working the overnight shift. At 2:47am while on WB I-64 near Mason Road he clocked on radar a black Ford Fusion at 87mph in the 60mph zone.

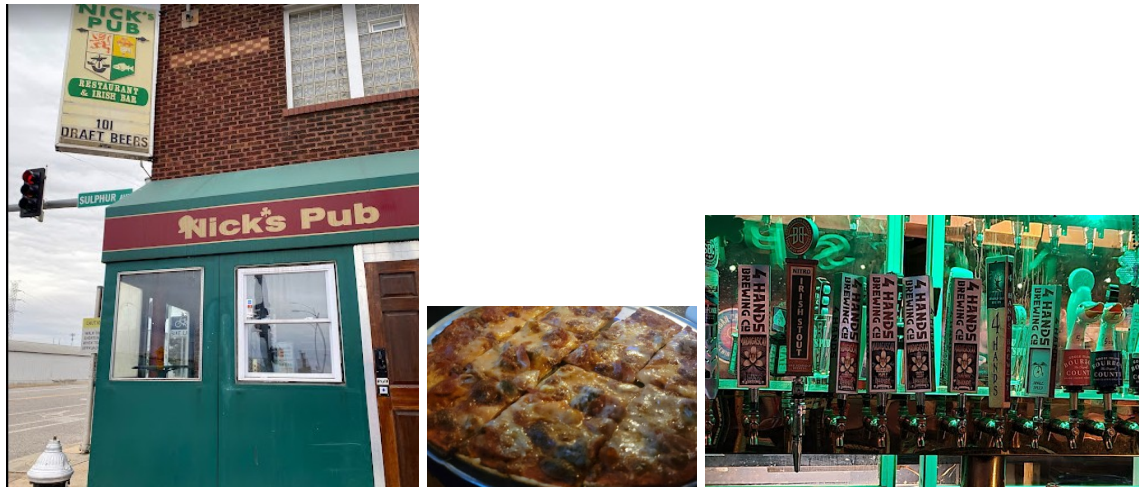

Upon stopping the Ford and contacting the driver, Joseph Adlabi 31 of Ballwin, Officer Hamel could immediately tell the Adlabi had been drinking. This is from the police report:

Adlabi stated he had been at a friend's birthday party at Nick's Irish Pub in South St. Louis.



Adlabi while on the street told Officer Hamel that he had “like” two beers over 4 hours.

Adlabi failed some of the sobriety tests and agreed to take a field breath test that showed he was intoxicated with a BAC level of 0.11%. He was arrested. The car was released to his girlfriend who was a sober passenger.

At the police station Adlabi agreed to take an “official” breath test that showed his BAC was dropping but that he was still legally drunk. The BAC level was at .104%.

In an interview Adlabi stated his beer consumption went from 2 to 2 ½ hours. He admitted that he thought he was intoxicated. Then he said the strangest thing of the night. He said he started he had his 2 ½ beers between 2 and 3 o'clock. Considering

he made it from South St. Louis to Town and Country and was stopped for speeding at 2:47 by Officer Hamel.

OUTCOME: On August 21, 2023 Adlabi appeared in T&C Municipal Court with his defense attorney Tim Devereux (a County ast. Prosecutor in the 1970s). He pled guilty to DWI and was given a 2-year SIS (no fine, no points, no permanent record) probation term. The speeding charge and no insurance charge were reduced to parking violations with \$383 in fine. Adlabi who was doing 27 over the speed limit while drunk left the courtroom with no points on his driving record.

DRUNK DRIVER SPEEDING AND LANE WEAVING ON I-64 SAID HE MOTHER WAS WORRIED ABOUT HIM. It was Thursday night into Friday on December 22, 2023 at 12:54am. Town and Country Police Sgt. Freddie Yaakub was west on I-64 when he observed a silver Honda Accord in front of him with no headlights or taillights on. The driver was also speeding as Sgt. Yaakub clocked it at 79 MPH in the 60 zone. The vehicle then began weaving.

The Honda slowed and speed up and continued to weave. Sgt. Yaakub got the driver to stop after he exited I-64 onto North Outer Forty Road in Chesterfield.

The vehicle had Colorado license plates and the driver lived in Lakewood, Colorado. When asked why he was driving without his lights on after midnight. The driver, Syed Alam 32, said he thought the lights turned on automatically. When asked why he was speeding he replied that he had been out with friend and thought his mother was worried about him.

When asked why he was weaving the answer was he was thinking about his mother worry about him. It was clear that Alam had been drinking at a restaurant in downtown St. Louis and when asked how much he had to drink he said “two airplane bottles of Saki.”

He agreed to do field sobriety tests which he failed. He agreed to take a field breath test that showed his BAC level was .130%.

He agreed to be interviewed. He stated that he had been drinking Saki and moonshine at the Blue Ocean, a Japanese restaurant in St. Louis and did consider himself under the influence of booze. The Blue Ocean is not in downtown St. Louis, but is on Delmar in University City.

He pled guilty to DWI and was placed on a 2-year SIS (no points, no fine, no permanent record) probation, The Weaving Charge was dropped by the prosecutor. The speeding charge and driving at night without headlights were reduced to Parking Violations with \$382 in fines. Alam left court with no moving violations on his record.

Officers went to the door and contacted Alvi, but he would not step outside. The officers needed a warrant or permission from the homeowner to make the arrest inside the house. Alvi bolted, ran further into the house and up some stairs.

It was obvious the 23-year-old Abdul did not own the \$2.3-million house. His father invited the officers inside to look for Abdul, however Abdul had come back downstairs and was arrested for Stealing. He stated, "I just went up there (to the Phillips 66 store) because I was angry." He did not explain why he was angry.

During booking Alvi's family requested that on release he be taken to the nearby Mercy Hospital for a mental health evaluation. Alvi was issued a summons for stealing. He agreed to go to Mercy and a West County EMS & FPD ambulance and paramedics responded and transported him.

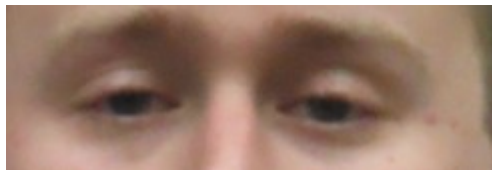

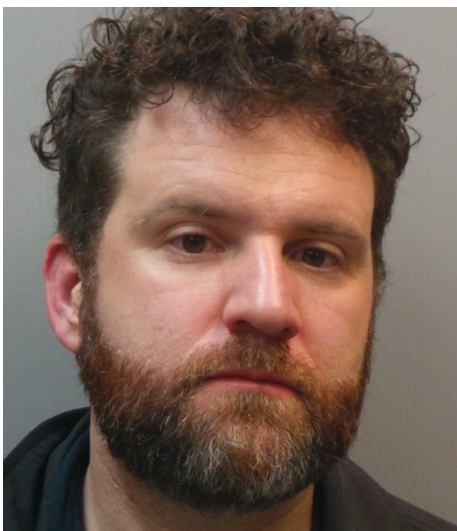

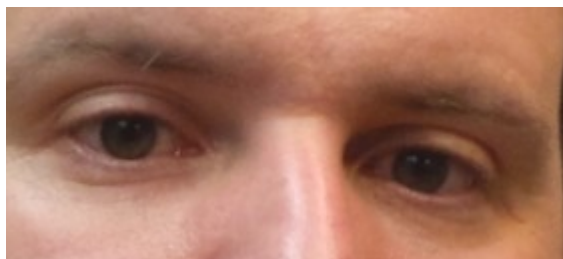
